PUBLIC WORKS

ARROW HIGWAY MEDIAN LANDSCAPING

Public Works Staff have been working with City of La Verne on a potential grant that would allow for landscaping of the currently bare medians on Arrow Highway, between White Avenue and Orange Grove Avenue, in both cities. The grant is now in the third stage of review through the California Natural Resources Agency (CNRA) Urban Greening grant program, and prospects appear good that this grant may be approved.

The work limits shown in the attached exhibit are mostly in the City of Pomona. However, in an effort to reduce City of Pomona costs and work in partnership with our neighbors, the City of La Verne is acting as lead agency for this project.

Attached is also a proposed planting plant palette that has been refined through the first two steps of the CNRA grant process. The planting palette is intended to allow low water use and high carbon sequestration.

If this grant is approved, Staff will plan to recommend a corresponding project for approval by City Council and some percentage of City funded cost (to be determined) should be expected. With necessary approvals, construction is expected, approximately, within 2 years.

PUBLIC WATER SYSTEM HEALTH & SAFETY: CYBERSECURITY

This week an alarming story made newspapers and television headlines regarding a possible "hacker" gaining access virtually through the cloud, from a remote computer, to a water treatment plant in Oldsmar, Florida. The hacker altered chemical dosages used in the water treatment process to potentially dangerous levels.

The City of Pomona's Water Resources Department (WRD) follows industry best practices relating to onsite servers and cyber security. The method used by WRD significantly reduces the vulnerabilities that are linked to the cloud-based system used in the Oldsmar hacking.

It is important to know that our system has multiple levels of embedded security, all designed to keep the water system safe. In addition to the many levels of security software, the WRD system has an air-gapped server that has no incoming internet connection.

Additionally, in many cases, our system's onsite controls located at each facility will shut down the plant automatically before certain chemical and physical parameters are exceeded. If and when these situations occur, alarms are sounded and sent to operators to allow them to make any necessary adjustments to the system.

Given the current and ongoing security measures within the WRD's systems, the public can rest assured that we will continue to provide safe and reliable drinking water to the public.

The Mass Vaccinate Hub began operations on Friday, February 5th in Cal Poly Pomona's

Lot B and Parking Structure 2, off of W. Temple Avenue and S. Campus Drive. The university has set-up an information site with FAQs and directions for the public to review.



The vaccine distribution site

operates 7 days a week **BY APPOINTMENT** from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Hours subject to availability of the vaccine. Individuals who arrive at the site without an appointment will be turned away.

STATE EVICTION MORATORIUM & ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

STATE ASSISTANCE FOR TENANT & SMALL PROPERTY OWNERS – OPENS MARCH 2021

This new Program will allocate the \$2.6 billion in federal rental funds for California and aid income-qualified tenants most at-risk with unpaid back rent. Assistance will also be extended to property owners who agree to waive 20 percent of unpaid rent. By agreeing to this waiver, property owners will become eligible for 80 percent in rent reimbursements for amounts owed between April 1, 2020 and March 31, 2021.
