"HERO PAY" URGENCY ORDINANCE

Due to specific impacts to retail employees during the COVID-19 pandemic, the City Council enacted a requirement for "HERO Pay" for designated employees in the retail sector. These designated employees have been classified as essential and have continued to perform their duties in the front-lines of the pandemic.

The "HERO Pay" ordinance requires certain qualifying retail establishments within the City of Pomona to provide premium pay of an additional \$4.00 per hour to their workers for at least 120 days. This requirement went into effect immediately on March 1, 2021 and will be in place until June 29, 2021, unless it is extended by the City Council. PUBLIC WORKS

METROLINK RAIL MAINTENANCE - MARCH 4-9, 2021

In order to maintain the safe operations of trains, Metrolink will perform track maintenance on the San Bernardino Line beginning March 4 through March 9, 2021, between 8:00 p.m. through 6:00 a.m. This activity will test the track strength, alignment, and surface of the tracks. Noise from equipment, vibrations, dust, and light from towers should be expected. Please note dates and times are subject to change without notice. There may be additional clean-up and preparation work before and after the project is completed. <u>VALLEY BOULEVARD MAJOR STREETS CONSTRUCTION – STARTS NEXT</u> WEEK

Beginning March 8th through summer 2021, Valley Boulevard, from Temple Avenue to Humane Way, is planned to undergo major reconstruction. As early as March 4th, drivers will begin to see traffic control measures allowing for two-way, single-lane traffic movement on the south side of Valley Blvd., while work begins on the north side of the street. This temporary traffic pattern is expected through mid-April at which time work on the south side of the street will begin. Announcements on social media will be made at that time.

The reconstruction of Valley Boulevard will be particularly intensive due mainly to the need to remove old concrete under the existing surface of old asphalt. Please spread the word about this pending construction project and be prepared for significant delays during this major construction work on Valley Boulevard.

The City of Pomona's Contractor, All American Asphalt, will be constructing "Major Street Rehabilitation – 2015 Metro Call", Project No. 428-67918, which includes Valley Boulevard and other streets as discussed further below. This \$10M project is made

possible in part by a \$3M Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) grant from which funding has been made available starting this fiscal year 2020-21.

The main grant funded work of this project will be to add Active Transportation in the form of bicycle facilities on all of the following streets:

- Valley Boulevard (Temple Avenue to Humane Way)
- Orange Grove Avenue (Fairplex Dr. to Casa Vista Dr. and Artesia St. to Arrow Hwy.)
- Park Avenue (Mission Boulevard to Olive Street)
- San Antonio Avenue (County Rd. to Franklin Ave. and Phillips Blvd. to Mission Blvd.)
- McKinley Avenue (Fairplex Drive to Towne Avenue)

These streets and potential additive alternate streets (Humane Way, additional portions of McKinley, etc.) are shown on the attached ("Metro Call") Map, and the planned construction for these streets is to include pavement rehabilitation in addition to the bicycle facilities. The pavement rehabilitation will range from slurry seals to thin and thick grind and overlays, as well as the Valley Boulevard reconstruction. Construction of the above streets is expected to be complete within 1 year (Valley is intended to be completed mainly in the Spring & Summer of 2021). See attached REVISED map.

<u>DISTRICT 2 & 3 COMMUNITY CLEANUP EVENT – SATURDAY, MARCH 13th</u> It's time for the annual Community Cleanups!

This year the Cleanup Event for Districts 2 and 3 will take place on March 13th at the Pomona Valley Transfer Station, located at 1371 E. 9th Street, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Residents will be allowed to dispose of used oil, used oil filters, and electronic waste (TV's, computers and other electronic devices).

Residents in District 2 and District 3 will receive a postcard notice in the mail, courtesy of Valley Vista. The postcards include information on items that are accepted and those that are not (i.e. tires, paint or toxic waste).

VACCINES

NEW – Vaccines for Phase 1B & High Risk Populations

Starting March 1st, the rest of Phase 1B as outlined in the <u>California COVID-19 Vaccine Plan</u>, will be allowed to receive the COVID-19 vaccines. This group includes people in **Education and Healthcare**, **Emergency Services**, and **Agriculture and Food industries**.

Starting March 15th, as outlined in the <u>California COVID-19 Vaccine Plan</u>, healthcare providers may use their clinical judgement to vaccinate individuals aged 16-64 who are deemed to be at the very highest risk to get very sick from COVID-19 because they have the following severe health conditions:

- Cancer, current with weakened immune system
- Chronic kidney disease, stage 4 or above
- Chronic pulmonary disease, oxygen dependent
- Down syndrome
- Solid organ transplant, leading to a weakened immune system
- Pregnancy
- Sickle cell disease
- Heart conditions, such as heart failure, coronary artery disease, or cardiomyopathies (but not hypertension)
- Severe obesity (Body Mass Index ≥ 40 kg/m2)
- Type 2 diabetes mellitus with hemoglobin A1c level greater than 7.5%

Or, if as a result of a developmental or other severe high-risk disability one or more of the following applies:

- The individual is likely to develop severe life-threatening illness or death from COVID-19 infection
- Acquiring COVID-19 will limit the individual's ability to receive ongoing care or services vital to their well-being and survival
- Providing adequate and timely COVID care will be particularly challenging as a result of the individual's disability.

WesternU Pomona Vaccines

WesternU has been designated a Los Angeles County community health care partner providing vaccines in accordance with <u>COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution Guidelines</u>. In this capacity, WesternU will administer COVID-19 vaccinations to Los Angeles County residents and WesternU community members who meet the eligibility criteria. At this time, L.A. County is actively vaccinating health care workers, staff and residents at skilled nursing facilities, staff and residents at long-term care facilities, and Los Angeles County residents 65 and older.

FREE vaccinations began Thursday, Feb. 11, 2021 in WesternU's Health Professions Center Student Commons, 550 E. 2nd Street, Pomona, California 91766.

 WesternU eligible faculty, staff, students, and community members may schedule your COVID-19 vaccine appointment at <u>LA County Public</u> Health COVID-19 Vaccine website.

Cal Poly Pomona Vaccination Hub

The Mass Vaccinate Hub began operations on Friday, February 5th in <u>Cal Poly Pomona's Lot B and Parking Structure 2</u>, off of W. Temple Avenue and S. Campus Drive. The university has set-up an <u>information site</u> with FAQs and directions for the public to review.



The vaccine distribution site operates 7 days a week **BY APPOINTMENT** from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Hours subject to availability of the vaccine. Individuals who arrive at the site without an appointment will be turned away.

<u>Make an Appointment:</u> Schedule an appointment through **My Turn** (<u>myturn.ca.gov</u>), the State-operated registration system for scheduling vaccination appointments. Those without email or access to Internet can call the CA COVID-19 Hotline for assistance at 1-833-422-4255 on weekdays from 8 a.m. until 8 p.m. and from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. on weekends.

<u> STAY TUNED – FEDERAL COVID-19 FUNERAL REIMBURSEMENTS</u>

December 2020's Federal COVID-19 relief bill included a provision for reimbursing lowincome families for coronavirus-related funeral and burial costs. That funding has now been approved and FEMA is setting up a program to reimburse costs up to \$7,000. As soon as program details are announced, we will update you here. HOUSING IS KEY – STATE RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

STATE ASSISTANCE FOR TENANT & SMALL PROPERTY OWNERS – OPENS MARCH 2021

This new Program will allocate the \$2.6 billion in federal rental funds for California and aid income-qualified tenants most at-risk with unpaid back rent. Assistance will also be extended to property owners who agree to waive 20 percent of unpaid rent. By agreeing to this waiver, property owners will become eligible for 80 percent in rent reimbursements for amounts owed between April 1, 2020 and March 31, 2021.
