#### CITYWIDE MASTER FEE SCHEDULE UPDATE

The Finance Department will bring forward Resolution No. 2021-08 on April 5<sup>th</sup> requesting the approval to establish the City of Pomona's first ever Comprehensive Citywide Master Fee Schedule. The goal of this project is to create a single comprehensive modern document that displays the City of Pomona User Fees that recover the reasonable costs of providing the services, products, and regulatory activities to the Community. At the March 15th City Council meeting, the First Reading of an amendment to the City Code was brought forward that amends the City Code to establish a Master Fee Schedule, the second reading will also occur on April 5<sup>th</sup>. As part of the posting requirements the Wildan produced Master Fee Schedule will be available on the City's Website today, March 25<sup>th</sup>. The City Council report will go out next week as part of the normal agenda posting. #### PUBLIC WORKS

#### STREET PRESERVATION - LOCAL CITYWIDE FY 20-21

On March 15, 2021, the City Council awarded a construction contract in the amount of \$1,644,001.44 for "Street Preservation-Local Citywide (FY 20-21), Project No. 428-2590-xxxxx-68562". The contract for this project was awarded to Gentry Brothers, Inc. (Contractor). This project will consist of rehabilitating existing streets per the City's Pavement Management Program, with treatments ranging from slurry seal to thick grind and overlay. The street list and Location Maps are below. Some curb and gutter, sidewalk, and curb ramp upgrade work are also included. Streets awarded as additive alternates will be completed, as funds allow.

Construction is scheduled to start spring 2021 and be completed fall 2022. If weather, Pomona Unified School District schedule, and other factors allow, the project will meet its proposed schedule. The Contractor will send notices to neighboring residents, businesses, and schools prior to starting work notifying them of the construction. The work hours will be 7 A.M. to 4 P.M. The adjacent neighborhoods can expect to see temporarily modified traffic flow during the project. This project supports the City Council priorities and goal of improving street and associated sidewalk conditions.

#### HAMILTON PARK PRELIMINARY DESIGN MEETING AND SURVEY

On Tuesday, March 23, 2021, City staff held a preliminary design meeting, where its landscape design consultant, Architerra, presented a preliminary design concept to the community for the Hamilton Park Renovation Project. In 2020, the City was awarded \$1.5 million from the California Department of Parks and Recreation Statewide Park Program, funded through Proposition 68, to renovate Hamilton Park. The City has since engaged Architerra to design the park to fulfill the vision of the grant, which includes adding new playgrounds for ages 2-5 and 5-12, a water refill station, renovated pathways, renovated and enhanced lighting to increase safety, a gazebo, horseshoe pits, a renovated basketball court to include an art feature to be determined by the community, renovated field, water-wise landscaping, and the planting of approximately 25 additional trees throughout the park. Three options for playgrounds were presented at this meeting and the City would like your assistance in determining which playground you would like to see at Hamilton Park. #### STATE EVICTION MORATORIUM & ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

On Friday, January 29<sup>th</sup>, new State legislation extending an eviction moratorium through June 30, 2021 was signed! Read more on the <u>Governor's website</u> and at the <u>Housing is Key</u>.

This new Program will allocate the \$2.6 billion in federal rental funds for California and aid income-qualified tenants most at-risk with unpaid back rent. Assistance will also be extended to property owners who agree to waive 20 percent of unpaid rent. By agreeing to this waiver, property owners will become eligible for 80 percent in rent reimbursements for amounts owed between April 1, 2020 and March 31, 2021.

#### EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT PROGRAM

The <u>FCC's Emergency Broadband Benefit</u> will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of

up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute \$10 to \$50 toward the purchase price.

The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.

A household is eligible if one member of the household:

- Qualifies for the Lifeline program.
- Receives benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program or the school breakfast program, or did so in the 2019-2020 school year.
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year.
- Experienced a substantial loss of income since February 29, 2020, and the household had a total income in 2020 below \$99,000 for single filers and \$198,000 for joint filers.
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating providers' existing low-income or COVID-19 program.

#### APPLY APRIL 2021 – FEDERAL COVID-19 FUNERAL REIMBURSEMENTS

Starting next month, FEMA will begin accepting applications for financial assistance for COVID-19-related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020. Of note, there is no requirement for the deceased person to have been a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien. Please visit the <u>FEMA website</u> for eligibility and the checklist for documents –such as official death certificate, receipts, etc.—you may start gathering now. If you are eligible for funeral assistance you will receive a check by mail, or funds by direct deposit, depending on which option you choose when you apply for assistance.
