DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

POMONA PERMITTING

The Development Services Department is leading a Citywide effort to evaluate the current development review process from permit application to permit issuance. An internal City task force has been convened to identify gaps and brainstorm possible solutions. Additionally, we will be launching a survey seeking feedback from the public and developers on their experience with the current process. Feedback will be used to enhance the City of Pomona's planning and permitting process, including customer service, efficiency, transparency, and future resources. These efforts will culminate in a report to City Council this fall on the response received, recommendations for improvement and next steps for implementation.

HOUSING ELEMENT

The Planning Division has completed its initial survey effort for Pro Housing Pomona, the City's update to the Housing Element. A total of 550 surveys were collected from Pomona residents, including 225 in-person surveys collected at multiple outreach events, and 101 surveys in Spanish. The comments received from these surveys, along

with feedback received at multiple targeted stakeholder meetings, the six-week Pro Housing Pomona Leadership Academy, and joint Council-Planning Commission session will inform a Public Review Draft of the document, which is expected to be released by the end of July. Upon circulation of the Draft, the Planning Division will conduct a second, 30-day round of outreach to solicit feedback on the proposed Housing Element.

POMONA RECEIVES SCAG GRANT

The City of Pomona has officially been awarded a \$703,500 grant from Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) to zone our streets! The grant will cover completion of a Citywide Complete Streets Ordinance and \$300,000 set aside for Quick Build demonstration projects to test traffic safety interventions citywide. The City is partnering with SCAG GoHuman and local community based-organizations Day One and institutions including California State Polytechnic University-Pomona, Western University of Health Sciences Pomona Valley Hospital Medical Center and Pomona Unified School District. Some of these ideas, such as parklets, through Activate Pomona (pictured) have already seen great success in the community. The Planning Division is thrilled to embark on an ambitious but necessary coordinated effort with Public Works Staff to reimagine 25% of our City—the public right of ways—as formally part of our centerline zoning, in a way that is inclusive, multi-modal, safe, culturally appropriate, legally defensible, and active.



COMMERCIAL CANNABIS PERMIT PROGRAM (CCPP) UPDATE

In October 2020, four businesses were selected to receive a commercial cannabis business permit to operate within the City. Since then, each business has actively worked to meet all local and state regulatory requirements. The first retail cannabis operator, Stiiizy, located at 1605 West Holt Avenue, officially opened its doors to the public last weekend. Two other businesses are Catalyst, located at 454 East Holt Avenue, and United Pomona dba New Generation, located at 196 University Pkwy are set to open later this summer and early fall, respectively. The fourth cannabis business, a microbusiness named ASHE Pomona, will be be located at 2547 Pomona Blvd. This will be a new build and is currently in plan check and anticipates construction commencing this summer.

Each business has or will enter into a Community Benefits Agreement, outlining commitments to collective bargaining, 30% local hires, living wage, continuing education, and an annual payment of one-percent of annual gross receipts associated

with the Permittee's location to directly benefit Sensitive Use(s) within 0.5 mile radius of the location.

KIDS WORLD POMONA FUNDED

On Tuesday, June 29th, the City of Pomona learned that Kids World Pomona, an all-abilities playground project, was awarded \$1.1 million as part of the California state budget passed by Governor Gavin Newsom and the California Legislature. This project was championed by Senator Connie Leyva and her team, based on a proposal that was advocated by several members of the Pomona community and submitted by the City. Kids World Pomona is part of a larger Civic Center Plaza renovation project that has been supported by several Councilmembers. This project is in the first stages of development and we look forward to bringing you more details in the future.

POMONA YOUTH GOING TO CAMP OAKES IN BIG BEAR

The City of Pomona Community Services Division is offering summer programming that will provide a variety of educational, recreational and social-emotional growth opportunities for Pomona youth. With young people being significantly impacted and further deprived of such opportunities due to COVID-19, Community Services is collaborating with YMCA Camp Oakes, an overnight camp located in beautiful Big Bear, CA. The goal is to send between 100-150 Pomona youngsters to sleep away camp this summer.

There are three weeks of overnight / residential camps available. All camps are a week long and will run from Sunday through Saturday:

- July 11-17
- July 18-24
- July 25-31

Community Services is working hard to help overcome socioeconomic obstacles the community may face in attending camp.

The City will be able to send youth ages 8-16 to camp for free, provided their household meets CDBG eligibility requirements. A \$50 refundable deposit is required to secure each participant's space. A refund will be issued after a participant attends camp.

City Staff will use Prop A funds to provide free transportation from Washington Park to and from Camp Oakes. Participants who do not have a sleeping bag, will be offered a free sleeping bag.

The City recognizes that for many families, this will be the first experience with an overnight camp, so they may have questions. City staff and Camp Oakes have made themselves available to answer questions. Additionally, Camp Oakes staff have / will continue to offer parent information nights via Zoom on Tuesday nights at 7:00 p.m. on July 6 and July 13. Community Services is also live-streaming the parent meetings at Washington Park Community Center.

Camp Oakes is an established camp that serves thousands of people each year. It has been owned and operated by the YMCA of Greater Long Beach since 1958 and is also accredited by the American Camp Association (ACA). The camp follows ACA protocol as well as State / County guidelines to keep kids safe during activities and during COVID. The Camp is also asking for participants to get a COVID test (with negative result) one week prior to coming to camp or show proof of being vaccinated.

There has been a very positive response to this opportunity with week one being completely booked. Interested parents / guardians, should complete the pre-application as soon as possible at bit.ly/campoakespreapplication. After the pre-application is received, the parent / guardian will get a call after pre-application has been reviewed.



EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT PROGRAM

The <u>FCC's Emergency Broadband Benefit</u> will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of

up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute \$10 to \$50 toward the purchase price. The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.
