UPDATED GUIDE ON WINDOWS ON HISTORIC PROPERTIES


One of the most frequently asked questions about properties within a Historic District is "Can old windows be replaced?" In many cases, replacing windows is not necessary and can damage the value of a historic building. As part of its update of the City's Historic Preservation Design Guidelines, the Planning Division has created a guide about

windows on historic buildings for the public. This guide discusses the City's policy on replacing windows, how to assess the condition of your windows, how to repair both historic wood and steel windows, and ways to make your home more energy efficient before replacing your windows. SOLAR PANEL INSTALLATION ON HISTORIC BUILDINGS



As of March 15, 2021, both renters and landlords can check for eligibility and apply for CA COVID-19 Rent Relief. EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT PROGRAM

The FCC's Emergency Broadband Benefit will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute \$10 to \$50 toward the purchase price. The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.

FEMA is accepting applications for financial assistance for COVID-19-related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020. Please call 844-684-6333 (TTY: 800-462-7585) or visit the <u>FEMA website</u> for eligibility and the checklist for documents –such as official death certificate, receipts, etc. If you are eligible for funeral assistance you will receive a check by mail, or funds by direct deposit, depending on which option you choose when you apply for assistance.
