<u>LEAGUE OF CALIFORNIA CITIES STREET VENDING ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION</u>

This week, DCM Gluba and Development Services Director Gutierrez participated in a virtual roundtable meeting conducted by League of California Cities representatives regarding Street Vending. Over 100 participants joined in the meeting representing cities from throughout the State. The majority of the discussion focused on cities' collective inabilities to effectively enforce against non-compliant street vendors under limitations of State law established by SB 926.

While Pomona's Sidewalk Vending Ordinance incorporates all industry best practices and reasonable regulations and restrictions, enforcement against blatantly non-compliant vendors is difficult within the parameters of existing law, a consensus view shared by the participating cities at the roundtable. The League will be convening a working group of impacted cities in an effort to explore options to address these challenges in future legislative cycles. City staff will continue to participate in these discussions and keep the Council and community apprised of any developments on this matter.

<u>CITIZENS OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE (COC) AUGUST 19, 2021 MEETING AGENDA ITEM – "MEASURE PG AT A GLANCE"</u>

The agenda for the August 19th COC meeting will be posted this week and includes an overview of the Measure PG – Transactions Use Tax (TUT) since its inception in April 2019. Measure PG was approved by the tax payers in November 2018 and went into effect in April 2019. POMONA CONNECT HOST ITS FIRST RESOURCE FAIR

On Saturday, August 8th, Pomona Connect held its first Resource Fair on the Civic Plaza. Over 400 Pomona residents attended the event and were able to access resources brought by over 20 vendors, in areas such as housing and utility assistance, health services, youth services and so much more. In addition to these resources, Pomona Connect hosted both a mobile vaccine clinic and testing site. Thirty-five Pomona residents were vaccinated and 24 residents were tested for the Covid-19 virus.

In addition to the services on site, 172 households registered to be part of Pomona Connect to be updated on resources and events throughout the City. More than 60% of those who registered for Pomona Connect showed interest in accessing at least three or more resources, with the top three needs being access to food, utilities and rental assistance.

EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT PROGRAM

The FCC's Emergency Broadband Benefit will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute \$10 to \$50 toward the purchase price. The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.
