PUBLIC WORKS

STREET CONSTRUCTION AND ASSOCIATED STRIPING

The City works with Contractors and Developers to replace and improve striping on newly repaved streets in a timely and cost effective manner. On recently completed projects, the City has received compliments on the improved visibility of replaced/new striping. The City is utilizing the latest striping standards for increased width (6 inches wide instead of the previous 4 inches wide) striping. The wider striping improves visibility for both automated vehicle sensors as well as human drivers, and this in turn can help pedestrians and bicyclists. The City is also aggressively implementing more bicycle facilities, with more bike lane striping, and bike routes with bike 'sharrows' (symbols on the pavement indicating to drivers that sharing the street traffic lanes with bicyclists is required) on many streets throughout Pomona, as identified in City's Active Transportation Plan.

- Once a street is repaved, everyone is interested in seeing the new striping get placed as soon as possible. However, time is needed between the construction of new pavement and replacement of striping to address the following matters: Small amounts of naturally occurring oils included with asphalt need time (typically, weeks) to wear off before striping and markings will properly adhere/stick to the new asphalt;
- Coordination between various entities (e.g. Caltrans, neighboring cities, railroads, developments, etc.) is needed to make certain new striping meets their various requirements;
- Contractor's schedules are also important and the City works to minimize costs for repaving streets by working with Contractor's schedules and their availability.
 By managing and reducing Contractor costs for striping, the City preserves limited funding to repave more City streets; and
- Other street location specific factors that may have impacts on the timing of replacement striping/symbols, such as minimizing business impacts, etc.

The City appreciates everyone's patience while the above important matters are addressed. Drivers, pedestrians and anyone using City streets are kindly requested to please watch for and cautiously follow temporary pavement markings (temporary tabs, paint, etc.) until permanent striping and symbols can be replaced on newly repaved streets. Thank you.

EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT PROGRAM

The FCC's Emergency Broadband Benefit will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute \$10 to \$50 toward the purchase price. The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.
