PUBLIC WORKS

VALLEY BOULEVARD TRAFFIC SIGNALS – TRAFFIC DELAYS

As part of the on-going Valley Boulevard construction project, please be informed that four (4) traffic signals within the project limits will be blacked out in order to complete the final improvements/installations and switch-over to the new equipment. Appropriate traffic control measures will be placed in the interim. Construction crews have scheduled two dates and locations for the traffic signal work, as follows:

October 12, 2021 – (Tuesday night) to October 13, 2021 – Wednesday (all day)

- Valley Blvd. and Temple Ave.
- Valley Blvd. and Omar St.

October 25, 2021 – Monday (all day)

- Valley Blvd. and Kellogg Dr.
- Valley Blvd. and Ridgeway Ave.

It should be noted that the Contractor is also expecting to perform repaying of the intersection at Valley Boulevard and Temple Avenue from the night of October 11, 2021 to early morning of October 12, 2021.

Additional lane closures may be necessary to complete the work, subject to weather conditions. <u>Heavy delay is expected on Temple Avenue and on Valley Boulevard during traffic signal and repaving installations</u>. <u>Avoid the area or expect heavy delays when traveling through the area.</u>

WILLIE WHITE RE-ROOF PROJECT

On October 5, 2021, a Request for Bids was released for the re-roof of the Willie White Park Community Center. Bids are due later this month. This re-roofing project is unique due to the need to modify the pitched area on top of the roof, as well as, add scuppers (an outlet or opening on the side of a building to drain water) that will convey drainage from the roof through the parapet wall to improve the roof drainage and help prevent leaks into the building. The City is bidding this project with a base bid that would install a single-ply PVC roof membrane. Improvements to the security camera system, with camera poles mounted to the top of parapet wall, will also be included, as funds allow. The work is anticipated to be completed by January 2022, subject to acceptable bid, weather, and material supplies.

EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT PROGRAM

The FCC's Emergency Broadband Benefit will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute \$10 to \$50 toward the purchase price. The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.
