WORKING TOGETHER TO IMPROVE AIR QUALITY

One of the City's goals is to reduce waste and provide essential service. In an effort to reduce food waste, the City will provide an organic waste collection service to residential customers in 2022. The new organic collection service is a result of SB 1383, a State mandate in an effort to improve air quality. This also supports the City's effort in moving toward zero waste. Residential customers will receive an insert along with their utility bill in English and Spanish.

Working Together To Improve Air Quality

RECYCLE FOOD WASTE – California passed a law, Senate Bill 1383, to improve air quality by reducing greenhouse gas emissions from organic waste disposal, such as food and landscape waste. Organic waste in our landfills decomposes and generates methane gas, a climate super pollutant 84 times more potent than carbon dioxide. Landfills are the third largest producer of methane. This methane emission from organic waste releases into the atmosphere, affects air quality, and contributes to global warming. To comply with this state mandate, the City of Pomona is required to begin a Food Waste Recycling Program for residential customers that will start in 2022. EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT PROGRAM

The <u>FCC's Emergency Broadband Benefit</u> will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for

households on Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute \$10 to \$50 toward the purchase price. The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.
