

<u>CITY OF POMONA ANNUAL REPORT ON DEVELOPMENT IMPACT FEES</u> (DIF) FOR FISCAL YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2021 (FISCAL YEAR 2020-21)

To comply with the State of California Government Code Sections 66001 and 66006, otherwise known as AB1600 requirements, the Finance Department will submit the City of Pomona Annual Report on Development Impact Fees (DIF) for Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2021 (Fiscal Year 2020-21) on the December 20, 2021 City Council Agenda. The public noticing requires that the final information be made available for public review at least 15 days prior to the Council Meeting. This information is available for Public Review in the City Clerk's Office located at City Hall. In addition, an electronic version can be found on the City of Pomona's website under the "NEWS" section or by clicking here.

Please note that on August 2, 2021, the City Council adopted Resolution 2021-89, adopting revised Development Impact and Connection fees. The effective date was October 1, 2021, and the new fee structure and fees associated with those will be reflected in the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Annual DIF report and is not in the scope of this upcoming report. HAMILTON PARK UPDATES AND RENAMING COMMUNITY MEETING

On Saturday, December 4, 2021, from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., the City will host a community meeting to present Hamilton Park Renovation project updates and offer residents the opportunity to provide input as to whether renaming Hamilton Park should be considered.

A request to change the name of Hamilton Park was received and presented to the Parks and Recreation Commission. The Commission asked Staff to host a community meeting to gather community input; area-resident input would be greatly appreciated as the name change is considered.

The City's Policy for Naming of Park and Recreation Facilities states, "Parks, facilities, or amenities which already bear the name of an individual will not be considered for renaming, to uphold the original intent of honor and respect, unless substantial evidence is later revealed that the individual was falsely credited with the honor for which the facility was named."

PUBLIC WORKS

HUMANE WAY and ROSELAWN ST. CONSTRUCTION - COMING SOON

Public Works would like to advise the public to avoid and find alternate routes from **December 15 through December 20, 2021** (dates may need to be adjusted based on weather conditions).

- Humane Way (from Mission Blvd. to Valley Blvd.) Major Repaving work; will be open to through traffic. Significant delays are expected and alternate routes are advised
- Roselawn St. (from Humane Way to Pomona Blvd.) Major Repaving work, CLOSED to traffic

The City of Pomona's contractor, All American Asphalt, will be constructing "Major Street Rehabilitation – 2015 Metro Call", Project No. 428-67918, which includes additive alternate work on Humane Way and Roselawn St. (between Pomona Blvd. and Mission Blvd.). This work is part of a \$10M project made possible in part by a \$3M Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) grant and the City of Pomona Capital Improvement Program. Please see attached map.

The main grant funded-work of this project is adding Active Transportation in the form of bicycle facilities on all of the following streets (see attached map):

- Valley Blvd. (Temple Ave. to Humane Way)
- Orange Grove Ave. (Fairplex Dr. to Casa Vista Dr. and Artesia St. to Arrow Hwy.)
- Park Ave. (Mission Blvd. to Olive St.)
- San Antonio Ave. (County Rd. to Franklin Ave. and Phillips Blvd. to Mission Blvd.)
- McKinley Ave. (Fairplex Dr. to Towne Ave.)
- Humane Way (from Mission Blvd. to Valley Blvd.)
- Roselawn St. (Humane Way to Pomona Blvd., pavement rehab only).

Some of the finish work on the above streets is taking longer than normal due to supply shortages associated with the COVID pandemic. The City asks for your patience while the Contractor completes this project.

EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT PROGRAM

The FCC's Emergency Broadband Benefit will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute \$10 to \$50 toward the purchase price. The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.
