
FREE COVID-19 SELF-TEST KITS

PUBLIC WORKS

GOLD LINE CONSTRUCTION AND CLOSURES - GAREY AVENUE

As construction continues for the Foothill Gold Line light rail project, crews will begin construction on Garey Avenue at the railroad crossing located north of Arrow Highway and south of Bonita Avenue. Construction activities include underground utility work and roadway reconstruction.

Starting February 14 and continuing through December 2022, please note the following information:

• Lane closures will be in effect in both directions 24 hours per day.

Allowable Working Hours:
7:00 AM – 8:00 PM, Monday

thru Saturday.

Due to miscellaneous construction/testing, occasional longer working hours and nighttime work may occur past 8:00 PM.

Garey Avenue consists of two lanes traveling in each direction (northbound/southbound). Please note that while one lane may be closed for 24 hours for construction, there will be one lane open in each direction at all times. During the construction activities along Garey Avenue, access to residential areas and businesses will be maintained at all times. Click here for more information.

<u>SCHEDULED FREEWAY CLOSURE - CALTRANS TO CONTINUE</u> REPAIRING NORTHBOUND SR71 POTHOLES

As part of the ongoing efforts to keep the roads and highways operational during construction of the SR71 Widening Project, Caltrans will continue repairs to the existing potholes along the northbound lanes of the SR71, between Phillips Dr. and Mission Blvd. This operation will require the full overnight closure of the northbound SR71 on February 11, 2022, from Rio Rancho Rd. to Mission Blvd. Closure will start at 10 p.m. and repairs are expected to be completed by Saturday, February 12, at 8 a.m. Click here for more information.

BRIDGE PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE PROGRAM

Under the Bridge Preventive Maintenance Program (BPMP), five bridges in the City of Pomona will undergo construction maintenance and repairs. The BPMP goals are to correct minor structural deficiencies before a bridge problem develops, and extend existing bridge lives.

The five (5) bridges scheduled for construction maintenance during spring and summer of 2022 are:

- 9th Street over San Antonio Wash
- 1st Street over Towne Avenue
- East End Avenue over San Antonio Wash
- Grand Avenue over San Antonio Wash
- Phillips Boulevard over San Antonio Wash

The construction maintenance and repairs of the five bridges is scheduled to begin within the next few months withan approximate completion date in the fall of 2022. There is a potential for traffic congestion or temporary bridge closures during this work. Please consider other alternative routes to avoid long travel periods on your daily drive.

The Department of Public Works appreciates your patience and understanding as we make these safety improvements.

SB 1383 ORGANIC WASTE REDUCTION REQUIREMENTS

SB 1383 is the biggest change to trash since California started recycling in the 1980s. As of January 1, 2022, California State Law requires residents and businesses to recycle food and organic waste together in an effort to combat climate change. Organic waste like food scraps, yard trimmings, paper, and cardboard make up half of what Californians dump in landfills. Reducing organic waste is one of the fastest and easiest ways Pomona residents can have an impact on the climate crisis.

Residents (both single family and multi-family homes) and business owners must begin placing suitable food scraps in the green bin (yard waste container) rather than in the black bin (trash container). The best way to do this is to place your food scraps in a compostable plastic bag, then place that bag in to the green can with your yard waste.

Suitable food waste includes fruits, vegetables, grains, meats, dry/solid dairy products, eggshells, tea bags, and coffee grounds. Green waste includes yard waste, grass clippings, leaves, plant pruning, flowers, twigs, and small branches that should continue to be placed directly into the green container. When the food and green waste is placed in the green can and collected during normal trash pick-up days, the green can waste will eventually be diverted to a facility for composting.

There will be no change to when your trash, recycling, and green containers are serviced.

<u>TRAFFIC SIGNAL POLE REPAIR COMPLETED – MISSION BLVD. AND SAN</u> ANTONIO AVE.

The traffic signal pole at the southeast corner of Mission Blvd. and San Antonio Ave. has been replaced as of February 8, 2022, and the signalized intersection has returned to normal operation. The traffic signal pole was knocked down due to the recent windstorm that ravaged many neighboring cities in Los Angeles County.

EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT PROGRAM

The FCC's Emergency Broadband Benefit (The Affordable Connectivity Program replaced the Emergency Broadband Benefit on December 31, 2021) will provide a discount of up to \$30 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute \$10 to \$50 toward the purchase price. The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.

FEMA is accepting applications for financial assistance for COVID-19-related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020.
