

## **HOUSING FEASIBILITY STUDY – REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS**

In partnership with the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) the City is seeking a consultant to conduct a parking, mobility and open space infrastructure, and housing feasibility analysis for Pomona's City-owned parking lots within its Downtown area to potentially support housing development and leverage the City's Transformative Climate Communities (TCC) project outcomes.

There are currently 26 parking lots owned by the City of Pomona's Vehicle Parking District (VPD) and approximately 21 of those lots would be included in this study. This analysis and pre-development planning work is necessary to support the future release of Requests for Proposals for the redevelopment of one or more of these lots for housing development, and to establish definitive strategies for parking management and allocation within the Downtown Pomona Specific Plan area, and the enhancement of multi-modal and open space amenities for future residents.

The proposed project also envisions supporting the City of Pomona's (City) sustainability goals, including energy and water efficiency. The goal of the parking analysis component is to provide a strategic plan with specific implementation measures outlining the City's options for future investments in the parking network to improve mobility, access and utilization in a way that is safe and convenient while minimizing auto congestion, reducing Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT), and associated impacts as well as informing the City where parking would be best suited and which lots do not need to remain parking and could be considered for housing or a mix of both.

The parking analysis shall also recognize evolving technology and future trends in parking systems, management strategies and service delivery. At this juncture, the City is interested in understanding existing parking supply and demand patterns, determining the impacts of future development on existing parking, and conducting a robust stakeholder engagement process intended to both inform the public of quantitative and qualitative findings related to parking and obtain input to shape the parking planning process.

This project will be funded with State Regional Early Action Planning (REAP) funding awarded to SCAG to support local governments and stakeholders with housing planning activities that accelerate housing production and meet the region's goals for producing 1.3 million new units of housing by 2029, as determined by the 6th Cycle Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA).

#### RIBBON CUTTING CEREMONY VALLEY BLVD. BIKEWAY

On Friday, March 25, 2022, the City of Pomona celebrated the grand opening of the highly anticipated Class IV Bikeway. The bikeway is the first protected two-way directional bike lane in the City.

The new protected bikeway features a concrete buffer between the bike lanes and regular traffic lanes, ensuring safety for people who commute on bikes. The bikeway also includes bike markers, signage and striping, and traffic signal improvements at the intersections of Temple Avenue and Valley Boulevard; and Kellogg Drive and Valley Boulevard.

The main grant-funded work of this project allowed the City of Pomona to add Active Transportation in the form of bicycle facilities on all of the following streets:

- 1. Valley Boulevard (Temple Avenue to Humane Way)
- 2. Orange Grove Avenue (Fairplex Drive to Casa Vista Drive & Artesia Street to Arrow Highway.)
- 3. Park Avenue (Mission Boulevard to Olive Street)
- 4. San Antonio Avenue (County Road to Franklin Avenue & Phillips Boulevard to Mission Boulevard)
- 5. McKinley Avenue (Fairplex Drive to Towne Avenue)

California State Polytechnic University, Pomona (Cal Poly Pomona) joined in the festivities with their annual Town and Gown event. Bicyclists participating in the event christened the bikeway after the ribbon cutting by cycling a 10-mile loop within the City of Pomona.

Along the route, riders were treated to a demonstration by the award-winning Go **Human** program, intended to help reduce collisions and encourage community to walk and bike more. The Cal

The City of Pomona, through a combination of community engagement and innovative design, intends to develop a complete streets network that transforms our streets into a safe and inclusive resource for the community.

<u>DISTRICT 4 and 6 COMMUNITY CLEANUP EVENT – SATURDAY, March 26</u> The Community Cleanup for Districts 4 and 6 was held on Saturday, March 26, 2022, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at the Pomona Valley Transfer Station.

Residents dropped off large volumes of materials, including electronic waste (televisions, computers, and other electronic devices), and used oil and oil filters.

Pomona Valley Transfer Station reported 525 vehicles participated and dropped off 51.79 tons of refuse, 7.39 tons of metal goods, 81 mattresses, and 12 box springs, all of which will be recycled. Participating in the event were Corporate eWaste Solutions, collecting and recycling electronic waste, and Waste Management Curbside, collecting and recycling used oil and filters.







## <u>CALTRANS WEEKEND CLOSURE OF NORTHBOUND STATE ROUTE 57</u> <u>EXTENDED – POSTPONED UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE</u>

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) announced a pavement replacement project to remove and replace concrete slabs on State Route 57 (SR-57). The extended weekend closure from South Diamond Bar Boulevard to Pathfinder Road in both directions will improve the ride quality and maximize service on the roadway. The extended weekend closure is anticipated to begin on Friday, April 8, and end on Monday, April 11.

## More information to follow when dates are confirmed by Friday, April 1.

Although this construction location is west of Pomona, residents' commute will be impacted along this route.

#### EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT PROGRAM

The FCC's Emergency Broadband Benefit (The Affordable Connectivity Program replaced the Emergency Broadband Benefit on December 31, 2021) will provide a discount of up to \$30 per

month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute \$10 to \$50 toward the purchase price. The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.
