COMMUNITY SERVICES

OUTDOOR AND ACTIVE - SPRING PROGRAMMING

Outdoor and Active is a Pomona Unified School District (PUSD) funded program administered by City staff to provide students with opportunities to participate in sports and nature-based activities. Youth Soccer and Mini Sports began April 4, 2022 and registration will be accepted until capacity is met.

For ages 7-12, Youth Soccer is being offered at Westmont Park. Activities include skill-building, drills focused on fundamental development, and league games. The program will be offered for six weeks, Monday through Thursday from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

For ages 4-7, Mini Sports is being offered at Martin Luther King, Jr. Park, Washington Park, Westmont Park and Willie White Park. The Mini Sports program offers an introduction to team sports and recreation games focusing on positive coaching and team building. The program will be offered for six weeks on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays from 2:45 p.m. to 3:45 p.m.

IT'S A WRAP! A RECAP OF SPRING EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

After School Recreation Spring Break Camp

During the week of March 28 – April 1, 2022, City staff held a full-day Spring Camp at Ganesha Park and Philadelphia Park, serving an average of 40 youth per day. Participants enjoyed arts and crafts, nature walks, flower pressing, Olympic style competitions, obstacle courses, and other team-building activities.

Outdoor and Active's Spring Sports Camp

During the week of March 28 – April 1, 2022, a three-day program at Westmont Park provided Pomona Unified School District students opportunities for physical activity, participation in sports, and recreation-based play and instruction. Participants were provided healthy snacks and received information on the benefits of being active and eating healthy.

Fifth Annual Spring Egg Hunt

On Saturday, April 9, 2022, City staff hosted a Spring Egg Hunt at Garfield Park, Kennedy Park Philadelphia Park, and Westmont Park. Each location offered family-friendly activities, crafts, games, music, and a visit from the Easter Bunny. The Egg Hunt supplied 12,000 eggs between the four parks and an estimated 250 attendees participated in this event. A special thanks to our community partners such as the dA Center for the Arts, Project Sister, Day One, Village Academy, Cal Poly Kellogg Honors College, Project Horseshoe Farm and representatives from the Pomona Police Department for helping to create a fun and safe event.

Despite canceling the 2020 Egg Hunt due to the pandemic, and offering a 2021 Spring Selfie event, Community Services was excited to bring back the Egg Hunt and looks forward to serving even more community members next year.

CALTRANS OFFERS FREE DUMP LOCATIONS AS PART OF EARTH DAY

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) District 7 is providing residents throughout Los Angeles and Ventura Counties an opportunity to remove household debris in one of several free Earth Day/Dump Day events on April 23, 2022. These events are part of the Clean California program to encourage responsible trash-handling practices and disposing of waste materials safely and properly. Dump Days also create awareness and lay the groundwork for a sense of community responsibility to help keep neighborhoods clean.

Earth Day/Dump Day below will take place on <u>April 23rd from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.</u> at the 2650 South Garey Avenue in Pomona. The event may end early if capacity is reached. Caltrans will have staff on site to accept household waste and approved debris at no charge.

Dump Day collections at all locations are limited to household solid waste, mattresses, glass, paper, and clean dirt (limited to a pickup load). Items that will not be accepted are batteries, propane cylinders, oil or petroleum contaminated products, vehicle filters, vehicles or vehicle engine parts, sand, liquid waste, salt/brine, detergents, used needles/sharps containers, medicine, bulbs, florescent tubes, tires, tire carcasses, tire split rims, chemical containers, hazardous waste, paint containers, electronics, treated wood, contaminated dirt, sewage, and asbestos.

Caltrans reminds motorists to properly secure and tarp all cargo loads prior to driving. Transporting unsecured loads is unsafe, illegal, and pollutes California's roads and waterways.

Tips for securing your load:

- Completely cover loads with tarps or cargo nets. Debris can escape from gaps.
- Remove loose material and trash before driving.
- Don't overload; keep materials level with your truck bed.
- Put light items lower, tie large items to the vehicle for traffic safety.

Part of Governor Gavin Newsom's California Comeback Plan, Clean California is a sweeping \$1.1 billion, multiyear cleanup effort to remove trash, create thousands of jobs and engage communities to transform roadsides and restore pride in public spaces. FREE COMPOST GIVEAWAY EVENT - APRIL AND MAY

The Public Works Department is pleased to announce upcoming free compost giveaway events taking place in April and May.

The first event will take place on Saturday, April 23, 2022, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at the City Yard located at 636 W. Monterey Avenue. Residents will be limited to four 32-gallon containers. This is a self-serve event. Residents are encouraged to bring durable containers, shovels, and gloves. The giveaway is on a first-come, first-serve basis. One of the City's franchise haulers is providing the truckload of compost.

The next three events will be on May 14, 2022, May 21, 2022, and May 28, 2022, also at the City Yard.



DISTRICTS 1 and 5 COMMUNITY CLEANUP EVENT – SATURDAY, APRIL 9

The Community Cleanup for Districts 1 and 5 was held on Saturday, April 9, 2022, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at the Pomona Valley Transfer Station. Public Works staff, along with Councilmember Steve Lustro, attended the event.

Residents dropped off large volumes of materials, including electronic waste (such as televisions, computers, and other electronic devices), used oil, and oil filters.

Pomona Valley Transfer Station reported 345 vehicles participated by dropping off 37.65 tons of refuse, 8.38 tons of metal goods, 63 mattresses, and 14 box springs, all of which will be recycled. Participating in the event were Corporate eWaste Solutions, collecting and recycling electronic waste, along with Waste Management Curbside, collecting and recycling used oil and filters









WILLIE WHITE PARK COMMUNITY CENTER - RE-ROOFING PROJECT

The re-roofing of the Community Center at Willie White Park, 3065 Battram St., Pomona, CA, has begun with AME Builders, Inc. as the roofing contractor due to ongoing leaks experienced at the building. This project will provide a new, modified pitched roof, and will replace and relocate security cameras to the top of the building using gooseneck mounts. Scuppers with splash pads will also be added for improved

roof drainage. Construction is anticipated to be completed by May 2022, as weather allows.

The building will be closed to the general public during construction. Playground equipment, the basketball court, and other facilities will remain open.
