City of Pomona Project Spotlight

The City of Pomona has been working with the SoCalREN Public Agency Programs to increase energy efficiency at the Pomona Public Library and Palomares Park. In fact, the City secured \$1.5 million in financing through our Revolving Savings Fund.

This ongoing project plans to retrofit fluorescent, CFL, and HID lighting with equivalent LED counterparts throughout these facilities' interior and exterior spaces as well as upgrade and optimize the Library's HVAC systems.
