COMMUNITY SERVICES

2022 OUTDOOR SUMMER MOVIE NIGHTS IN THE PARKS

Community Services believes that the more positive, family friendly activities that occur in our local parks, the safer the parks and their surrounding neighborhoods become. Simply put, the good activities will help deter the bad activities and promote the positive intended use of public recreational spaces.

With this shared belief, Community Services and Day One began partnering to host FREE outdoor movie nights in the parks in 2016. Together, this collaboration has provided a total of 26 movie nights between 2016 and 2020 (none in 2020 due to the COVID-19 Pandemic).

During the summer of 2022, this collaboration will host six movie nights at rotating parks throughout Pomona to increase accessibility and to expose community members to parks they may not have visited before. Movie nights will occur weekly on Fridays from July 8th through August 12th. Movies will begin at sunset and will be free and open to the public. See the <u>link to the flyer</u> outlining the dates, locations and featured films for all six (6) movie nights. Please join us and help spread the word!

Community Services is also exited to use a larger, thirty-foot inflatable movie screen and projector that was purchased to enhance the movie night experience at parks / facilities that are able to safely accommodate the dimensions.

UNANTICIPATED POOL CLOSURES A RESULT OF LIFEGUARD SHORTAGE

The City contracts with the YMCA of Orange County for the summer operations of Ganesha Park and Washington Park pools. There is currently a national lifeguard shortage that also impacts aquatics operations locally. This lifeguard shortage delayed the start of this pool season which has also resulted in reduced pool capacities and pool closures. There is a required ratio of one lifeguard to each 20 swimming participants at each pool to ensure swimmer safety.

Ganesha and Washington Park pools will be open on the 4th of July. In spite of the current lifeguard shortage, the YMCA currently has 10 guards scheduled for Pomona's pools.

Recently, Staff held a phone meeting with the YMCA Chief Operating Officer to further discuss expectations, the impact the closures have on the community and possible solutions. The YMCA assured the City they are working diligently on recruiting sufficient lifeguards and that the current shortage is impacting the region.

The YMCA currently has eight (8) prospective employees scheduled for lifeguard training on Friday (7/1). Additionally, they currently have six (6) pending interviewees who may potentially be added to the 7/1 training. The YMCA has been pulling from their other pools at times and paying mileage to help staff Pomona's pools.

City staff are also exploring other options should YMCA staffing levels not improve and closures continue.



UPDATE ON CALL FOR PUBLIC ART

Between March 15, 2022 and April 21, 2022 the City held the "City of Pomona Call for Visual Art" and accepted applications for the placement of publicly accessible permanent or temporary visual art or visual art programs at either a pre-approved location in City parks or some other location on public or private property accessible to the public.

The City received a high number of applications in response to the City of Pomona Call for Visual Art. The applications range greatly in size and scope as well as in the amount requested and location. The applications received by the City represent:

- 138 application from 54 individual artists or organizations
- 116 murals, 4 sculptures, 3 mosaic installations, 2 chalk art installations, among others
- 112 permanent projects, 15 temporary projects, and 9 programs
- At least 115 applications proposed in a location within a Pomona park
- The sum of all requests totals \$1,834,357.47
- 99 applications are from Pomona residents
- Requests range from \$350 to \$178,000
- All Council Districts represented

Staff will be bringing these applications forward for Cultural Arts Commission consideration at the next 2-3 Commission meetings in batches, with requests from at least one or two parks from each district at the July meetings, with another similar batch in August, and if needed September. Staff believes this is the most equitable way of moving applications forward with funds being distributed across all Districts and in as many neighborhoods as possible at any particular time.

PUBLIC WORKS

FULTON ROAD- FULL CLOSURE JULY 15 - JULY 18, 2022

The Foothill Gold Line Construction Authority's Contractor (Kewit-Parsons, AJV) will conduct a full closure of Fulton Road from July 15-July 18, 2022, for needed work at the rail crossing between Arrow Highway and Bonita Avenue. Work associated with this closure will occur around the clock beginning at 7:00 A.M. Friday through 7:00 A.M. Monday.

The Metrolink Station parking lot will only be open and accessible via the Santa Fe Street driveway (the Fulton Road driveway to the Metrolink parking lot will be closed). The detour for this closure will be on Garey Avenue via Bonita Avenue and Arrow Highway.

The schedule is weather permitting, and all dates and times are subject to change.

Detours will be posted. Motorists should expect delays and are strongly advised to avoid the area and use alternate routes.

STREET PRESERVATION - LOCAL FY 21-22

On April 4, 2022, City Council awarded a construction contract in the amount of \$2,335,605.90 for "Street Preservation - Local (FY 21-22), Project No. 428-2590-xxxx-68572". The contract for this project was awarded to Gentry Brothers, Inc. (Contractor). This project will consist of rehabilitating existing streets per the City's Pavement Management Program, with treatments ranging from slurry seal to thick grind and overlay, curb and gutter, sidewalk, and curb ramp upgrade work are also included. The Base Bid streets listed in the <u>Street List and Location Maps</u> are anticipated to receive funding first, followed by the Additive Alternate streets, as funds allow.

Construction is scheduled to start summer 2022 and be completed by winter 2022. If weather permits, the Pomona Unified School District schedule and other factors allow, the project will meet its proposed schedule. The work hours will be 7:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. The Contractor will send notices to neighboring residents, businesses, and schools prior to starting work, notifying them of the construction. Due to this work, the adjacent neighborhoods can expect to see temporarily modified traffic flow during the

project. This project supports the City Council priorities and goal of improving streets and associated sidewalks.

PHILADELPHIA / BUENA VISTA / MISSION REHABILITATION PROJECT STARTING SUMMER/FALL 2022

On June 6, 2022, City Council awarded a construction contract in the amount of \$4,119,411 for "Philadelphia Street Rehabilitation – From San Antonio Avenue to East City Limit (ECL)," Project No. 428-2590-XXXXX-68577; "Buena Vista Avenue Rehabilitation – Mission Boulevard to 9th Street," Project No. 428-2590-XXXXX-68576; and "Mission Boulevard Rehabilitation – White Avenue to Towne Ave," Project No. 428-2590-XXXXX-68576; and "Mission Boulevard Rehabilitation – White Avenue to Towne Ave," Project No. 428-2590-XXXXX-68576; and Avenue Ave," Project No. 428-2590-XXXXX-68576; and "Mission Boulevard Rehabilitation – White Avenue to Towne Ave," Project No. 428-2590-XXXXX-68576; and Avenue Avenue Avenue to All American Asphalt (Contractor).

This project will rehabilitate existing streets with pavement treatment, including but not limited to thick grind and overlay, sidewalk repairs, curb and gutter repairs, and curb ramp upgrade work. The rehabilitation limits are as follows and shown in the <u>Location</u> <u>Maps</u>:

- Mission Boulevard from White Avenue to Towne Avenue
- Philadelphia Street from San Antonio Avenue to Reservoir Street
- Buena Vista Avenue from Mission Boulevard to Ninth Street

Philadelphia Street from San Antonio Avenue to Reservoir Street will also continue the Class II bicycle lane that currently exists on the west side of San Antonio Avenue. This \$4M project is made possible in part by \$2.8M funds from the American Rescue Plan (ARP) made available starting in the 2021/2022 fiscal year. Construction is expected to begin in the Summer/Fall of 2022.
