#### **COMMUNITY MEETING—DRAFT FAIRPLEX SPECIFIC PLAN**

The Fairplex will be hosting an upcoming meeting to share the updated draft [Specific Plan](#) on Wednesday, August 31, 2022 from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. at the Pomona Unified School District Auditorium, 800 S. Garey Avenue, Pomona, CA 91766.

The Fairplex is currently engaged with the City of Pomona Planning Division, in partnership with the County of Los Angeles, to develop a Specific Plan to take a thoughtful and comprehensive approach to land use planning for the campus. The planning process began with an Open House Meeting in April, during which the initial draft plan was shared with the Pomona community and feedback was received. Additionally, the plan was shared in various types of engagement opportunities during the LA County Fair and in June. All of the comments and feedback received gave our team great perspective as Fairplex continues to develop a plan for the future that centers local and regional priorities on community, connectivity, sustainability and economic opportunity. We look forward to continuing to work with our community as we plan the future of the Fairplex.

## **FINANCE**

### **POMONA TO RESUME REGULAR UTILITY SERVICE PAYMENT PRACTICES**

Effective August 1, 2022, the City of Pomona resumed regular utility service payment and disconnection practices for delinquent customer accounts. Throughout the pandemic emergency, the City has made every effort to assist customers who have experienced difficulties paying their utility bill by:

- Suspended late payment penalties from March 2020 through June 2021.
- Suspended utility shutoffs for nonpayment from March 2020 through July 31, 2022.
- Utilized grant funds awarded by the State Water Resources Control Board to provide almost \$1,000,000 in credits to delinquent accounts.

The Payment/Shut-off timeline information is provided below:

1. The City provides customers with billing statements every 61 days.
2. Customers have 3 weeks or 21 days from the billing date to pay their water bill.
3. If payment is not received on the 21st day, the City will assess a 5% penalty on the total outstanding balance and the customer will be issued a past due notice on the 22nd day.
4. Delinquent bills must be paid by the 80th day after the billing date (postmarks are not acceptable) to avoid further penalties and service disconnection.

We understand the uncertainty and financial challenges that many households and commercial establishments are currently facing. Given these unique and unprecedented circumstances, we are offering impacted individuals and businesses the opportunity to request payment arrangements. ### **CITY FACILITY EVACUATION DRILLS**

The purpose of the drills is to train and equip City of Pomona Employees, Floor Wardens, and Points of Contacts with the evacuation process and their respective roles and responsibilities. The drills are designed to give City employees the tools and training required to handle a natural disaster and maintain the health and safety of our community.

**HILTON GARDEN INN**

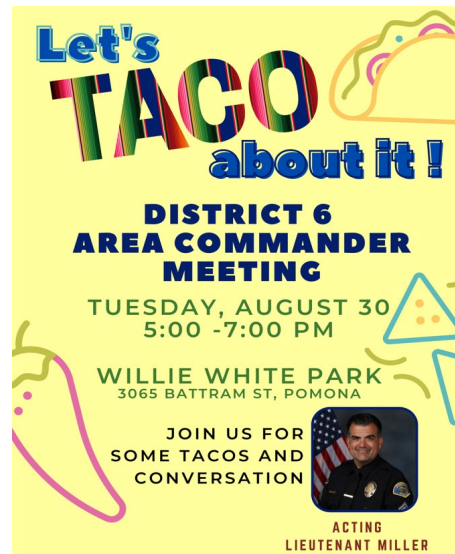

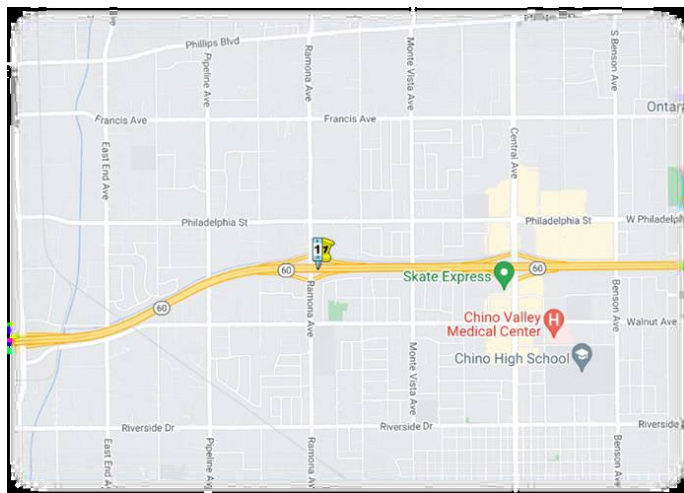
## ***PUBLIC WORKS***

### **SR-60 FULL 55-HOUR WEEKEND FREEWAY CLOSURE THIS WEEKEND**

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) construction contractors will perform pavement work and lane closures for the \$8.7 million State Route 60 (SR-60) Corridor Improvement Project at the Ramona Avenue Overcrossing in the City of Chino.

A FULL 55-HOUR WEEKEND CLOSURE will begin at 11:00 p.m. on Friday, August 26 and continue to 5:00 a.m. on Monday, August 29, 2022. Work will require EAST-BOUND (EB) FULL MAINLINE closures on SR-60 at Ramona Avenue. Traffic will be rerouted at the Ramona Ave. off-ramp back to SR-60. Anticipate traffic delays.

Closures are dependent on contractor receiving proper materials for each job function. They can be changed or canceled at any time.



### **FULL STREET CLOSURE – FULTON ROAD**

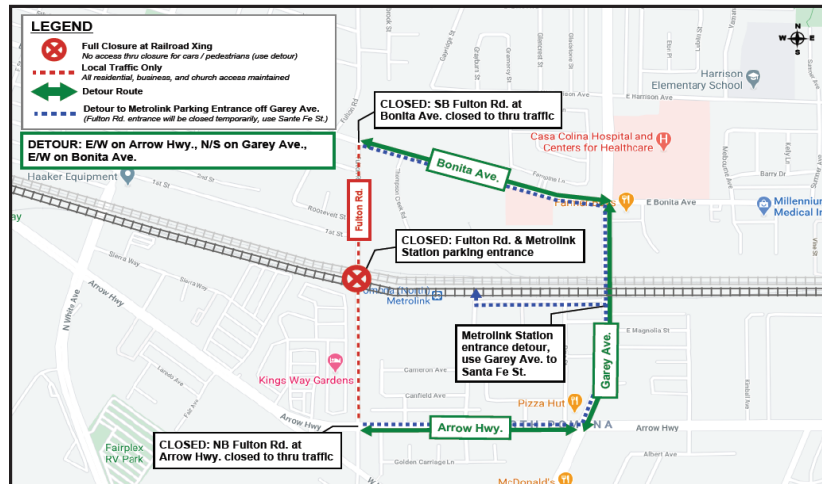
As part of the 9.1-mile Foothill Gold Line Project, the contractor, Kiewit-Parsons, will be completing the reconstruction of the Fulton Road railroad crossing to install new light rail tracks and Metrolink train control. After the contractor installs the new light tracks and train control, the crew will complete the bridge wing and retaining walls, as well as completing the roadway and hardscape. This will result in a full closure of Fulton Road at the railroad crossing for up to 45 days, including the temporary closure of the

Metrolink Station parking entrance on Fulton Road during these activities. The full closure will begin on Tuesday, September 6 through Friday, October 21, 2022. The contractor may also work Sundays or overnight, if required.

Access to homes, businesses, and churches on Fulton Road within the closure area north and south of the railroad crossing will be maintained at all times, as well as access to 1<sup>st</sup> Street, Roosevelt Street, and Brandt Street. The Metrolink Station driveway on Fulton Road will be closed temporarily.

Residents and businesses located near the Fulton Rd. rail crossing, between Arrow Hwy. and Bonita Ave., are advised to anticipate noise.

Detour routes (green arrows shown on map) will be in place during the closure and signage will be posted to direct motorists and pedestrians, as well as Metrolink customers. Please follow the detour signs.



## **WATER RESOURCES**

### **SAN GABRIEL VALLEY COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS TRANSIT STUDY**

San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG), in partnership with the Los Angeles Metro, successfully conducted Phase 1 of the Transit Study between July 2021 and June 2022, and has now begun Phase 2 of the Transit Study analysis which is expected to continue through July 2023.

The study is evaluating short and long-term transit options designed to enhance the lives of residents, commuters and visitors, with a focus on equity and the most vulnerable population: public transit-dependent communities and population constrained by existing transportation systems.

On September 20, 2022, the SGVCOG will be hosting two virtual meetings to provide the public with information about the San Gabriel Valley Transit Study's latest progress, and will continue welcoming your feedback. ### **NO OUTDOOR WATERING - UPPER FEEDER SHUTDOWN BEGINS SEPTEMBER 6TH**

Starting September 6<sup>th</sup>, residents and businesses are being asked to suspend outdoor watering for 15 days as a critical imported water pipeline will be shut down for emergency repairs.

The Metropolitan Water District, joined by its member agencies and local retail water agencies has sent out a water-saving call to stretch Southern California's severely limited water supplies as Metropolitan repairs this pipeline.

The 36-mile upper feeder pipeline is an important part of Metropolitan's regional water system delivering Colorado River water into Southern California. After a leak was discovered in the pipeline earlier this year, Metropolitan made a temporary repair and began operating the pipeline at a reduced capacity while a more permanent solution was designed and developed. The repair will be performed from September 6-20, during which the pipeline will be shut down.

Below are tips on how residents and businesses can prepare their landscaping for this shutdown – ensuring it will thrive again once the shutdown is complete – and what to do indoors to reduce water usage.

### **PRIOR TO SHUTDOWN**

#### **General Landscaping**

- Delay new plantings until after September 20<sup>th</sup>. Avoid fertilizing lawns and plants prior to the shutdown.
- Weed your garden to help make more water available for your plants.
- **Set your sprinkler timer to the “OFF” position on the evening of September 5<sup>th</sup>.**

#### **Lawns**

- Aerate your lawn and add compost two weeks prior to the shutdown.
- Set mowers for a higher cut or avoid mowing. Longer grass helps reduce evaporation.
- Do a normal watering of your lawn according to your agency's watering schedule.

#### **Shrubs/Flowers/Ground Covers**

- Water deeply and early in the morning of Monday, September 5<sup>th</sup>, or on the last day, hand watering is allowed in your community before the shutdown.
- Add mulch around your plants three inches from the stem. Do not irrigate mulch, pull it away while watering then put back into place.
- Shade your plants where possible with sun cloth, canopy tents or umbrellas.
- Water succulents and other desert plants as normal. Overwatering could harm them.

#### **Trees**

- On Monday, September 5<sup>th</sup>, or on the last day hand watering is allowed in your community before the shutdown, deep-water your trees and shrubs by hand watering, setting soaker hoses or watering with a regular hose on a slow trickle. Water until soil is soaked to a depth of 8-12 inches.
- Surround the tree with mulch before watering for added moisture retention. Make sure the mulch is three inches from the trunk.

### **DURING THE SHUTDOWN (September 6-20)**

#### **Outdoors**

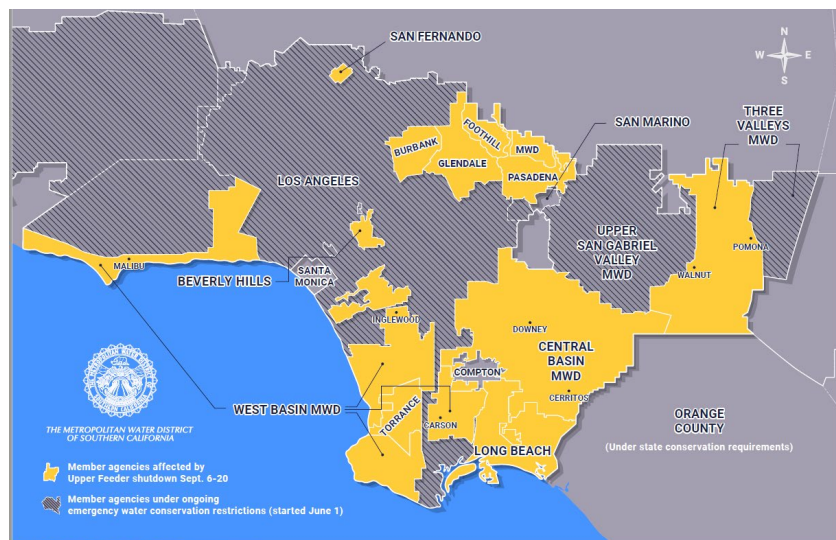
- Eliminate all outdoor watering.
- Remember, **two weeks of no watering will not kill your lawn.** Though you will see a noticeable yellowing, it will green up once your normal watering schedule resumes.

- Do not mow your lawn. Minimize the use of your lawn for playing, parking vehicles.

## Indoors

- Put a bucket in your shower to collect water as the shower warms up. Use for houseplants, sensitive outdoor plants and areas of the lawn that may show excessive stress (hot spots).
- Take short showers (5-minute max)
- Do not leave water running when washing dishes. Fill a small bin or bucket with water to wash your dishes in. When you're done, use that water for trees and grass.
