HOLIDAY CLOSURE IN OBSERVANCE OF LABOR DAY

In observance of Labor Day, City Hall and all City Facilities will be closed on Monday, September 5, 2022. <u>Trash collection</u> will be delayed by a day and there will be no <u>street sweeping services</u>. Regular business hours will resume on Tuesday, September 6, 2022 at 7:30 a.m.

POWER FLEX ALERT

The California Independent System Operator, or CAISO, issued a Flex Alert for yesterday and today, due to predicted high-energy demand and tightening available power supplies. CAISO is asking Californians to conserve energy from 4-9 p.m., when energy demand is expected to be the highest, in order to protect grid reliability. The Flex Alert could be extended through the Labor Day weekend.

Currently, <u>CAISO has not indicated the need for rotating outages</u> to reduce stress on the electric grid. They alert customers as quickly as possible should it become necessary. When SCE prepares to initiate rotating outages, the location of impacted circuits is displayed on their outage map at <u>sce.com/outage</u>. To learn more about CAISO's system alerts and energy emergencies, please visit <u>caiso.com</u>.

Given the forecast for continued high temperatures, SCE is taking a number of actions:

 Encouraging residential and business customers to conserve energy through Tuesday, Sept. 6, since customer conservation efforts are instrumental in helping maintain electric service during significant heat waves; this includes our demand response programs, which customers signed up for to help conserve energy;

- Continuing to evaluate planned maintenance work that requires a power outage and actively canceling or postponing projects unless they directly impact the safe delivery of electricity to customers; and
- Scheduling additional crews and customer service representatives to be on call
 throughout the weekend to respond quickly to critical repairs and customer
 questions; we also are staging equipment in areas that could be the most-heavily
 impacted.

SCE will maintain updated outage information at sce.com/outage.

Below, please find some actions that customers can take to support the Flex Alerts and conserve energy.

To prepare for the Flex Alert, customers can take these steps before 4 p.m.:

- "Pre-cool" homes or lower air-conditioning thermostats.
- Charge electric vehicles.
- Charge mobile devices and laptops.
- Run dishwashers, washing machines and other major appliances.
- Set pool pumps to run in the early morning or late at night.

Here are some other ways customers can conserve energy:

- Set your thermostat to
- 78 degrees when you are home and to 85 degrees or "off" when you are away.
- Cook with a grill outside, or microwave, to keep your home cooler.
- Give your air conditioner a rest when you can and cool your home with open windows and fans when you can.
- Shut off lights when leaving a room.
- Close your blinds to keep out the afternoon heat.
- Limit the opening and reopening of refrigerators, which are major users of electricity in many homes.
- Plug home electronics into power strips and turn off power strips when equipment is not in use.
- Unplug electronic devices and chargers when they are not in use.
- Give your dryer a break 4-9 p.m. and hang dry your clothes, if you can.

When possible, businesses should shift power-intensive work to morning or lateevening hours.



POMONA TO RESUME REGULAR UTILITY SERVICE PAYMENT PRACTICES

Effective August 1, 2022, the City of Pomona resumed regular utility service payment and disconnection practices for delinquent customer accounts. Throughout the pandemic emergency, the City has made every effort to assist customers who have experienced difficulties paying their utility bill by:

- Suspended late payment penalties from March 2020 through June 2021.
- Suspended utility shutoffs for nonpayment from March 2020 through July 31, 2022.
- Utilized grant funds awarded by the State Water Resources Control Board to provide almost \$1,000,000 in credits to delinquent accounts.

The Payment/Shut-off timeline information is provided below:

- 1. The City provides customers with billing statements every 61 days.
- 2. Customers have 3 weeks or 21 days from the billing date to pay their water bill.
- 3. If payment is not received on the 21st day, the City will assess a 5% penalty on the total outstanding balance and the customer will be issued a past due notice on the 22nd day.
- 4. Delinquent bills must be paid by the 80th day after the billing date (postmarks are not acceptable) to avoid further penalties and service disconnection.

We understand the uncertainty and financial challenges that many households and commercial establishments are currently facing. Given these unique and unprecedented circumstances, we are offering impacted individuals and businesses the opportunity to request payment arrangements. 
FULL STREET CLOSURE - FULTON ROAD

As part of the 9.1-mile Foothill Gold Line Project, the contractor, Kiewit-Parsons, will be completing the reconstruction of the Fulton Road railroad crossing to install new light rail tracks and Metrolink train control. After the contractor installs the new light tracks and train control, the crew will complete the bridge wing and retaining walls, as well as completing the roadway and hardscape. This will result in a full closure of Fulton Road at the railroad crossing for up to 45 days, including the temporary closure of the Metrolink Station parking entrance on Fulton Road during these activities. The full closure will begin on Tuesday, September 12 through Friday, October 28, 2022. The contractor may also work Sundays or overnight, if required.

Access to homes, businesses, and churches on Fulton Road within the closure area north and south of the railroad crossing will be maintained at all times, as well as access to 1st Street, Roosevelt Street, and Brandt Street. The Metrolink Station driveway on Fulton Road will be closed temporarily.

Residents and businesses located near the Fulton Road rail crossing, between Arrow Hwy. and Bonita Ave., are advised to anticipate noise.

Detour routes will be in place during the closure and signage will be posted to direct motorists and pedestrians, as well as Metrolink customers. Please follow the detour signs.



NIGHTTIME WEEKEND METROLINK TRACK IMPROVEMENT WORK BEGINS THIS WEEKEND

To keep train service safe and reliable, Metrolink will be performing extensive railroad improvement work. Crews will be working along the railroad tracks in the City of Pomona east of the Metrolink Pomona - North Station in the new maintenance yard near North Garey Avenue. There will be no Metrolink passenger train service on the Labor Day Weekend so this work can be completed. Work will begin daily at 11 p.m. until 2 a.m. from Friday, September 2 until Tuesday, September 6.

During this work, Metrolink anticipates the following impacts:


- Noise from equipment backup alarms and heavy machinery
- Vibrations and dust from construction machinery and activities
- Lights from light towers and/or on-track equipment

WATER RESOURCES

<u>CUSTOMERS ARE ASKED TO LIMIT IRRIGATION FOR TWO WEEKS</u> STARTING SEPTEMBER 6TH



In order to help prevent with water shortages during a <u>MWD pipeline repair</u>, Pomona customers are being asked to temporarily stop outdoor irrigation for 15 days, starting September 6, 2022. During this time, the MWD pipeline that brings water from the Colorado River Aqueduct to the City of Pomona, and the surrounding area, will be shut off to receive emergency repairs. Because of this, residents and businesses are being asked to shut off their sprinklers and automated irrigation systems. If necessary customers can hand water areas needing irrigation.

Once the repair is completed, customers may return to their watering schedules.

POMONA AWARDED GRANT FROM MWD FOR LEAK DETECTION AND REPAIR

The Water Resources Department, working with the Three Valleys Municipal Water District (TVMWD), was awarded Metropolitan Water District's (MWD) Municipal Leak Detection and Repair Grant Project totaling up to \$100,000. The grant allows the City to upgrade aging leak detection equipment and software. The upgraded equipment will help the City detecting leaks, and the grant helps fund necessary repairs. The project aligns with MWD and TVMWD's mission to supplement, and enhance local water supplies required to meet our region's needs in a reliable and cost effective manner. The project is estimated to be completed by June 30, 2024.
