WHO PAYS THE TAX?

The special tax will only apply to properties zoned for industrial use or identified as an industrial use by the Los Angeles County Assessor.

Residential properties will <u>not</u> be subject to the special tax.

HOW MUCH?

Eligible properties will be taxed at a rate up to \$0.15 cents per square foot of parcel size annually.

The special tax could generate up to approximately \$14 million dollars annually to be used on infrastructure related improvements.



STREETS

Up to 216 miles of streets are eligible for improvement, including replacement of asphalt with concrete to reduce needed maintenance and roadway vibrations.



INTERSECTIONS

Up to 173 intersections are eligible for improvements, including new synchronized traffic signals, in order to improve traffic flow and reduce truck idling.



STREET LIGHTS

Up to <u>835 street lights</u> are eligible for replacement, in order to improve safety and visbility.



IN-N-OUT COVER TO COVER CLUB




DISTRICT 3 AREA COMMANDER MEETING


WATER RESOURCES



WATER CONSERVATION-SEPTEMBER 2022



The City and Waters Resources Department applaud our customers for doing a great job of conserving water and achieving a 19 percent water reduction compared to 2020. This reduction occurred despite the irrigation water shutdown in September due to a pipeline repair to the upper feeder.

Weather is often a significant driver of water consumption, but despite September having higher temperatures, Pomona reduced its water use to record levels.



Finally, Pomona customers have ramped up their voluntary water waste reporting. In September, reports of water waste escalated by 77 percent compared to 2020. To aid in continued water savings, residential customers can find a list of rebates and programs at https://www.bewaterwise.com/.
