METROLINK LAUNCHES DISCOUNT PROGRAM FOR LOW-INCOME TRAIN RIDERS

Metrolink passengers with a California Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) card are eligible for a 50 percent <u>discount</u> on all Metrolink <u>tickets and passes</u>. Riders can use their EBT card at any Metrolink station ticket machine to validate and unlock the discount.

Funding for the discount is made possible by a grant from the Low Carbon Transit Operations Program (LCTOP), administered by the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans).

VOTE CENTERS IN POMONA FOR 2022 MIDTERM ELECTION

The Statement tells the story of how Pomona developed from the earliest adobes to the recent past. While not intended to provide every detail of Pomona's history, it provides a general history development that identifies important aspects of Pomona's past.

CITY STABLES

Five years ago, the City Stables building experienced a catastrophic failure when a portion of the walls and roof collapsed. City Council directed Staff to include reconstructing the stables as part of the new Water Resources Department building.

This week that reconstruction process began. The first step was the demolition of the existing stables building. Planning and Water Resources department staff were on-site to ensure decorative elements were saved (to be reinstalled on the reconstructed building), and that great care was taken during the demolition process. The next step will be to test the building components for hazards such as asbestos and salvaging as much of the building as possible for use in the new building which is anticipated to be completed by the end 2023.



POLICE

OCTOBER IS NATIONAL PEDESTRIAN SAFETY MONTH

October is National Pedestrian Safety Month and the Police Department would like to raise awareness about the safety of people walking, emphasizing "safe drivers, safe speeds and safe vehicles save lives." The safety of pedestrians is a significant traffic safety concern. At least two pedestrians or bicyclists are killed on California roads every day. Between 2010 and 2019 in California, pedestrian deaths increased more than 40 percent and bicyclist deaths went up more than 60 percent. In 2020, 6,516 pedestrians were killed in the United States – an average of 18 pedestrians a day and one pedestrian killed every 81 minutes. Speeding, poor lighting, mid-block crossing and impairment are the main factors in pedestrians being struck by vehicles.

Pomona Police Department offers the following safe driving and walking tips:

Drivers

- Do not speed, slow down at intersections. Be prepared to stop for pedestrians at marked and unmarked crosswalks.
- Avoid blocking crosswalks while waiting to make a right-hand turn.
- Never drive under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs.

Pedestrians

- Use signalized crosswalks where drivers expect foot traffic.
- Watch for approaching vehicles and be careful crossing the street, especially busier streets with higher speed limits. At 30 mph, a driver needs at least 90 feet to come to a stop.
- Get in the habit of wearing light colors, reflective material, and using a flashlight at night so you are visible to drivers.

PUBLIC WORKS

CITY OF POMONA BULKY ITEM COLLECTION PROGRAM

City of Pomona residents, including multi-family residents, with trash collection service are eligible to schedule a bulky item pick-up.

Each household is allowed six) requests per calendar year with a limit of one request per bi-monthly billing cycle, provided at no charge. Each additional bulky item pick-up requested within a billing cycle during the calendar year will be provided for a fee of \$25.00 (per unit of service). The Bulky Item pick-up charge will be billed on the following regular statement of services under Solid Waste Charges.

A bulky item is a large item such as a refrigerator, stove, or dresser. Additionally, the City considers the following items to be scheduled as a single item: table and chairs, washer and dryer, sofa, and loveseat. The City does not accept hazardous waste materials, such as paint, paint thinners, tires, hypodermic needles, motor oil, pesticides, or herbicides.

Contact Customer Service at 909-620-2241 to schedule the pick-up on your regular trash collection. Place the item(s) on the curb the night before or no later than 5:00 a.m. on the date scheduled. Please note that there is a maximum capacity, and preference is given to early callers.

Representatives are available to schedule items for pick-up Monday through Thursday between 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. City Hall is closed every Friday.
