METROLINK LAUNCHES DISCOUNT PROGRAM FOR LOW-INCOME TRAIN RIDERS

COMMUNITY SERVICES

VETERANS PARK SOCCER COMPLEX CLOSURE

As of February 1, 2023, Veterans Park Soccer Complex will no longer be available for field rentals due to deteriorating turf conditions and pending sale of the property.

Veterans Park opened on June 28, 2008 and featured the City's first synthetic turf fields. The 11-acre soccer complex included four full sized fields, a concession building, restroom facility, bleachers, picnic tables, and a parking lot. At its peak, Veterans Park Soccer Complex served over 100,000 (duplicated) visitors annually. It is important to note that only about 35% of the parks users were Pomona residents.

Due to popularity, synthetic fields have been made available through Pomona Unified School District and Sofive Soccer Center, formally known as Goals, as well as other local cities. As with any type of infrastructure, there is need for eventual repair and replacement. In recent years, the condition of the synthetic turf has worsened. The average life expectancy of the synthetic turf at Veterans Park was eight years and it has exceeded its life expectancy at 14 years. Turf removal, disposal, preparation, and replacement is costly and is anticipated to run approximately \$2M-\$4M.

After careful consideration and research, in October 2019, the City Council approved the sale of Veterans Park to Seven Street Development Inc. The intention with the sale of the property was to reinvest the proceeds into expanding and enhancing recreational space throughout the city for Pomona residents.

Veterans Park is located on northwest of the intersection of Mission Boulevard and the 71 freeway, where the former General Dynamics facility was located. The sale of the property has been delayed because the property has a federal deed restriction mandating that the property be used in perpetuity as recreational space, therefore if the land were to be sold, the change in use must have the approval of the Secretary of the Department of Interior. This process is ongoing.

City staff have notified current user groups of the closure, which include soccer leagues and clubs, including informing league representatives of alternative natural grass fields operated by the City as well as facilities offered through Pomona Unified School District. Above all, the City prioritizes player safety. To explore natural grass field options at City of Pomona parks, please call 909-620-2301.

<u>HARVARD BLOOMBERG INNOVATION PROGRAM - TOGETHER WE</u> THRIVE!

This month, the City's Innovation Team concluded a year's long innovation program through the <u>Bloomberg Harvard City Leadership Initiative</u>! The team focused on how Pomona can imagine new possibilities for early learning and development in young children ages o-5. The Bloomberg Harvard Innovation Track was an 11-month cohort-based training that helps cities learn how to adopt a design-based innovation approach to solve challenging problems in new ways by engaging residents in testing, adapting, and scaling creative ideas. Through three key phases: the understanding phase, the generate phase and the deliver, the team interviewed community members, youth organizations and teachers to gain their perceptive on the existing problems facing children ages o-5. Based on those interviews, 5 key themes emerged:

- 1. Based on interviews, the lack of a central information source and inconsistent distribution leads to roadblocks in accessing information about childcare for families seeking resources and options. Families in need of childcare feel lost and don't know where to get information and give up. As a result, parents may not access programs for their children or access substandard programs, those children are less likely to be prepared for kindergarten, may be less likely to access resources over time, and may have long term negative academic and social consequences.
- 2. Collaboration, coordination and communication is not prioritized between citywide, youth focused systems that provide programming for ages 0-5 and is often inconsistent. Based on interviews, consistent interaction between public, non-profit and private organizations serving youth ages 0-5 is fractured and not cohesive. As a result, resources are not maximized, efforts are ineffective and lead to communal frustration and result children ages 0-5 don't reach their full potential.
- 3. There is not a collaborative and consistent funding approach for programs focused on the o-5 age group that supports the holistic development of programming citywide and individual organizational sustainability. This lack of cohesive funding strategy and inability to fund programs creates inconsistent opportunities, unpredictable funding for organizations, and confusion among the community. It diminishes consistency towards program delivery. Leads to inequitable distribution of resources for families, inconsistent curriculum ,lack of access and educational readiness, and poor coordination and potential duplication of efforts among different organizations/entities.
- 4. Families find Pomona's public spaces, ie., parks. sidewalks and plazas to be unwelcoming environments due to perceived levels of crime and uncleanliness. Families do not feel safe and are reluctant to use public spaces so they either choose a space outside the City or don't venture out at all. Children are at a social deficit due to lack of opportunity to engage with the community and other children in outdoor spaces which also delays overall development.
- 5. Many parents want to be involved in the activities or access support, but either distrust institutions with legal authority that may offer those resources, because of past negative experiences with such authorities, or due to poor literacy or other indicators that make it difficult to pursue resources. This leads to parents and children not accessing the programs that exist and not asking for help when needed. Parents may feel isolated and unsupported, distrust perpetuates and institutions like cities struggle to reach those most in need.

Based on what the team learned, the team went through human-centered design-based approach to generate new ideas to help address the problem. Two ideas emerged to be developed into prototypes (pictured below): 1) a "special delivery" basket to give to new parents with resources and a few essential baby items, and 2) information gathering about community members trusted circle, a network of trusted messengers that can provide needed information and improve access to early childhood resources. The team learned that beyond the physical basket or small gift that it was the gesture of reaching out to the community that was appreciated, welcomed and helped establish a trusting community/City relationship.

Ultimately, the team developed a portfolio of three initiatives for the City to pursue, those include: 1) the special delivery box, 2) establish a parent advisory group, and 3) establish a family success hub, which would function as a digital dashboard for centralized resources and a family resources center. Next steps include the City integrating the innovation mindset into city operations, moving the organization toward a culture of possibility government, which means opening up to new ideas, using experimental approaches to learn which ideas work, and scaling up the ones that do. The four themes that will drive the City forward into expanding the innovation mindset include:

- **Possibility Government:** Bringing innovation mindset to future projects and policy-making.
- **Collaboration:** Strengthening our partnerships and finding feedback loops.
- **Sharing Data**: Come to the table as one to build trust so that we can share data openly.
- **Community Engagement:** Meeting people where they are at. Getting every Department to re-think engagement.

The Innovation team is 13 member cross-disciplinary team, comprised of city staff from 7 different Departments, our Mayor, a Councilmember, the Deputy Superintendent for Pomona Unified School District and the CEO of a local community based non- profit Justice4 youth.

ZONING CODE UPDATE

Over the last year the City of Pomona Planning Division has been working on comprehensively updating the City's Zoning Code, the first complete overhaul since its creation in 1949. In addition to aligning our Zoning Code with our adopted 2014

General, this is an opportunity to update regulatory language to be more inclusive equitably representative community. Community engagement on the draft document is anticipated to begin in April 2023. Staff is currently developing content for multiple forms of community engagement (meetings, events, pop-ups, & social media) on the Zoning Code update to input diversify and reach as many community members as possible.



PLANNING COMMISSION

This month, the Planning Division is discussing the existing Zoning Code use standards with the Planning Commission at their regularly scheduled meetings. These discussions will include how to improve use regulations as well as thoughtfully recognize and address cumulative impacts of uses for neighborhood wellbeing. Following this month's discussions and feedback Planning Division staff will begin drafting potential use standards for the Zoning Code update.

HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

Over the past 6 months Planning Division staff and the Historic Preservation Commission have discussed each section of the existing Historic Preservation Ordinance. Next month, at their regularly scheduled meeting, the Planning Division will introduce a completed Draft Historic Ordinance and discuss how Historic Districts and the new Historic Preservation Ordinance will be addressed in the new Zoning Code.



FULL STREET CLOSURE - GAREY AVE AT RAILROAD CROSSING


As part of the 9.1-mile Foothill Gold Line Project, the contractor, crews will be fully rebuilding the railroad crossing for the new light rail system on Garey Avenue in the City of Pomona. This will result in a full closure of Garey Avenue at the railroad crossing for approximately 45 days. The full closure will begin on Wednesday, February 1, 2023, and extend through Friday, March 17, 2023. The contractor may also work Sundays or overnight, if necessary.

Access to homes and businesses on Garey Avenue within the closure area north and south of the railroad crossing will be maintained at all times, as well as, access to the Metrolink station from Arrow Highway and Fulton Road or Pine Street. Residents and businesses near the Garey Avenue rail crossing are advised to anticipate construction noise.

Detour routes (green arrows shown on the map below) will be in place during the closure, and signage will be posted to direct motorists, pedestrians, and Metrolink customers. Please follow the detour signs.

Detour Routes (Green Arrows seen on the map below):

- **Towne Avenue** (northbound and southbound) will serve as the main detour
- **Arrow Highway** (eastbound and westbound) will remain open to traffic
- **Bonita Avenue** (eastbound to westbound) will remain open to traffic



RISK MANAGEMENT

SAFETY

Prepare! Don't let severe weather take you by surprise. (weather.gov/safety)

Be Weather-Ready: Check the forecast regularly to see if you're at risk for severe weather. Listen to local news or a NOAA Weather Radio to stay informed about severe thunderstorm watches and warnings. Check the Weather-Ready Nation for tips.

Sign Up for Notifications: Know how your community sends warning. Some communities have outdoor sirens. Others depend on media and smart phones to alert residents to severe storms. To follow City of Pomona alerts text "**POMONAPD**" at **888777** or visit www.nixle.com to sign-up.

Create a Communications Plan: Have a family plan that includes an emergency meeting place and related information. Pick a safe room in your home such as a basement or an interior room on the lowest floor with no windows. Get more ideas for a plan at: https://www.ready.gov/make-a-plan

Practice Your Plan: Conduct a family severe weather drill regularly so everyone knows what to do if a damaging wind or large hail is approaching. Make sure all members of your family know to go there when severe weather warnings are issued. Don't forget your pets.

Prepare Your Home: Keep trees and branches trimmed near your house. If you have time before severe weather hits, secure loose objects, close windows and doors, and move any valuable objects inside or under a sturdy structure.

Help Your Neighbor: Encourage your loved ones to prepare for severe thunderstorms. Take CPR training so you can help if someone is hurt during severe weather.
