INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

INFRASTRUCTURE MODERNIZATION

Information Technology Department is undergoing network infrastructure modernization, namely by first replacing network switches that are nearing end-of-life. The new and modern network switches can deliver speeds up to 1 Gigabit (1000 Megabits) speed instead of 100 Megabits. While speed and performance gains are expected, the biggest benefit is strengthening the City's cybersecurity posture as new equipment are continuously supported and patched by the manufacturer to address vulnerabilities and bugs.

In mid-January, IT deployed two new switches in a controlled environment. The deployment was a success and without incident, IT is now moving forward with three more deployments this week. A total of 28 switches will need to be replaced and expect to be completed this Fall.

TAKING A TEST DRIVE

During the Fall of 2022, Information Technology equipped select police patrol vehicle's MDCs (Mobile Data Computers) with FirstNet SIM cards to benchmark its performance and compare it with City of Pomona's current carrier. The test results at the time did not suggest any significant performance gain, but shortly after IT's assessment FirstNet launched another tower in Pomona to boost signal strength and improve performance. Consequently, IT is partnering up with the Police Department once more to assess FirstNet along with enterprise router equipment to find ways to provide faster and more reliable cellular connectivity for our patrol officers.


LIBRARY



COMPLETE STREETS PROJECT

The City of Pomona is designated as "disadvantaged community and low-income community" by nearly every major equity and public heath indicator in the State, defined as areas throughout California which most suffer from a combination of economic, health, and environmental burdens. These burdens include poverty, high unemployment, air and water pollution, presence of hazardous wastes as well as high incidence of asthma and heart disease. The City has begun multiple initiatives prioritizing community engagement with city government, with a particular emphasis on accountability to residents that may have been historically marginalized.

Those initiatives include a comprehensive zoning code update, implementing equity in budgeting and the creation of a community outreach and community-based social marketing plan to guide meaningful and robust community outreach. In addition the City has recently kicked off its Complete Streets Initiative which is intended to take a



drastically different approach to the way streets are used and designed throughout the city. While streets have historically been prioritized to move cars as quickly and efficiently as possible, all too often those designing streets gave little consideration to other users like pedestrians and bicyclists. The Complete Streets Initiative will address this imbalance by taking a new approach that will prioritize people first.

The current Zoning Code Update, which is developing new standards for all properties, will be complimented by the Complete Streets Initiative, which will develop new standards for all streets. As part of this effort, there will be on-going community outreach, including a Community Advisory Committee, as well as temporary demonstration projects known as "quick-builds" to test some of the new street

standards. Our efforts focus on a human-centered approach to ensure we are listening to the experiences and voices of those most impacted—our community.

PUBLIC WORKS

FULL STREET CLOSURE - GAREY AVE. AT RAILROAD CROSSING

As part of the 9.1-mile Foothill Gold Line Project, the contractor and crews will be fully rebuilding the railroad crossing for the new light rail system on Garey Avenue in the City of Pomona. This will result in a full closure of Garey Avenue at the railroad crossing for approximately 45 days. The full closure began February 1, 2023, and will extend through Friday, March 17, 2023. The contractor may also work Sundays or overnight, if necessary.


Access to homes and businesses on Garey Avenue within the closure area north and south of the railroad crossing will be maintained at all times, as well as, access to the Metrolink station from Arrow Highway and Fulton Road or Pine Street. Residents and

businesses near the Garey Avenue rail crossing are advised to anticipate construction noise.

Detour routes (green arrows shown on the map below) will be in place during the closure, and signage will be posted to direct motorists, pedestrians, and Metrolink customers.

Detour Routes (Green Arrows seen on the map below):

- **Towne Avenue** (northbound and southbound) will serve as the main detour
- Arrow Highway (eastbound and westbound) will remain open to traffic
- Bonita Avenue (eastbound to westbound) will remain open to traffic

LOW INCOME HOUSEHOLD WATER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Behind on your water bill? The City has been enrolled in the California Department of Community Services & Development (CSD) Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) since June 2022. The program is a federally-funded program that offers low-income households a one-time payment (up to \$2,000) to help pay outstanding bills for residential water or wastewater costs.

If you are struggling to pay your water bill, please visit https://csd.ca.gov/waterbill to see if you qualify for payment assistance. Since the program launched last summer, 80 Pomona customers have applied for assistance, and their accounts have been paid in full totaling \$101,896.
