INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

BROADBAND INTERNET STUDY

On March 27th, the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) notified the City of Pomona that we were awarded \$315,000 for its Local Agency Technical Assistance (LATA) Grant. The CPUC LATA grant was then formally accepted during the City Council Meeting on April 17th. The LATA funds can be used for pre-construction work relating to broadband internet access in the City of Pomona. This includes costs assessment study on broadband accessibility, availability, and affordability challenges in the city, as well as feasibility study on how those challenges can be overcome or lessened. Check back for updates in the upcoming months.

I CAN SEE CLEARLY NOW

We can all see clearly now that the rain is gone, but very soon, you can also clearly watch City Council meetings from the comfort of your home in High Definition! The City of Pomona's broadcasting partner, Spectrum, finished installing a new fiber line and encoder in the Council Chamber. 

WATER RESOURCES

DRINKING WATER WEEK, MAY 7-13

We are joining the American Water Works Association to recognize Drinking Water Week during the first week in May, from May 7-13. We drink water without considering where it comes from and whether it is safe. Unfortunately, polluted drinking water can be responsible for many illnesses, which is why awareness is so important.

Water Week helps us think about the significant role that safe drinking water plays in keeping us healthy. It also makes us realize the importance of being aware of whether our water is safe or not. This year, Drinking Water Week encourages residents to recognize and honor the critical work that water professionals accomplish around the clock to deliver quality tap water while bolstering resilience for water in the future.



WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM – WATER SAMPLING STATIONS



The Water Resources Department has water-sampling stations throughout the City's water distribution system. The purpose of these stations is to facilitate the collection of routine water quality samples. Every week, the water quality team collects individual water samples from 35 designated sample stations. Before collecting samples, staff conduct an onsite field analysis for pH, temperature, and chorine residuals.

Samples collected are sent to an independent laboratory where they are analyzed for coliform. This data is ultimately reported in our Consumer Confidence Report, which is available on the City's website.

Please remember to help keep our water safe by:

• Eliminating excess use of fertilizers;

- Properly disposing of pet waste;
- Properly disposing of chemicals such as used motor oil; and
- Never flushing medications down the toilet.
