





POMONA STABLES - DEMOLITION CLEANUP

The historical Pomona City Stables Building has been demolished and the debris is being prepared for environmental disposal. Asbestos material is part of the rubble that is currently onsite at 636 W. Monterey Avenue. Due to the presence of asbestos, the City is processing disposal per the South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) requirements. The workers that are moving the debris are equipped with personal protective equipment and clothing. Additional precautions have been taken to monitor the air quality around the perimeter of the site. The fence around the site has been covered in plastic and air-sampling devices have been installed on the fence. The debris is being collected, compiled, and wrapped in plastic before being placed in a steel sealed container for disposal.

City Staff that work at the site are notified about the debris disposal. There is warning tape around the perimeter of the debris site fence. No person is allowed within the

fenced disposal area without proper personal protective equipment. Compliance with OSHA, AQMD, and local environmental standards are being practiced to protect public health.







WATER RESOURCES BUILDING - CONSTRUCTION

Construction of the Water Resources Building site has started vertical construction.

This building site will replace the existing Water Yard at 148 N. Huntington Street. Three buildings are included at the 738-768 W. Commercial Street site. The warehouse (738),administrative (752), and reconstructed Pomona Stables (768) buildings will be in multiple stages of construction for the remainder of 2023. Due to the proximity of homes across the street from the construction site, the contractor ensures there is no debris or construction materials left in the local right-of-way.

In support of community improvements, the building project will include tangential projects. There is additional greenspace proposed within the localized project area near the intersection of









Commercial Street and Newman Street. A full street reconstruction including pavement, sidewalk, curb, and gutter improvements for Huntington Street and Commercial Street is being proposed.
