In addition, there will be two spots available to work directly with the Recreation (Communications) Coordinator, where teens will learn how to take photos, edit videos for social media, create and write captions for posts, learn how to boost engagement, and track analytics.

The Youth Employment Program provides Pomona youth, ages 14-19, with employment opportunities, life skills, on-the-job training, and mentoring opportunities that help

POMONA SUMMER CONCERT SERIES KICKS OFF JUNE 3RD

The City is excited to bring back FREE summer concerts! In 2019, the City hosted a summer, three-concert series that took place in July, August, and September at Civic Center Plaza. The community response was very positive and the intention was to



continue this as a new summertime tradition. After a two year break due to COVID-19, the series returned in 2022 with Adelaide Pilar, who performed a Selena tribute and sang covers of Latin hits that drew more than 250 people to the Civic Center Plaza.

Thanks to the approval of \$400,000 by the Mayor and City Council, we will expand these free community concerts for the next four years. This summer's five-concert series will kick-off on Saturday, June 3, 2023 from 3:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. at Civic Center Plaza and feature live music from a variety of performers and bands. A highlight to the lineup includes Pomona's very own Alejandro Aranda, who was the runner-up for the seventeenth season of

American Idol in 2019. We also have a surprise performer that will be announced on June 1st. So bring your lawn chairs and picnic blankets, and enjoy an afternoon of beautiful weather, family-friendly activities, and delicious offerings from various food trucks.

Please also mark your calendars for the four remaining concerts that are scheduled for the last Friday of June, July, August, and September. We look forward to providing Pomona residents with positive opportunities to gather and connect through our free summer concert series. PUBLIC SERVICE RECOGNITION WEEK

tireless efforts and valuable role of its employees. Additionally, events were held throughout the week celebrating *milestone* anniversaries for full-time employment with the City of Pomona. The service pins program had been relinquished during the recessionary years, and this week seemed like the ideal opportunity to reinstate the issuance of Service Pins. Excitement was in the air, as over 300 employees received service pins for 5 - 35 years of dedicated service to the City of Pomona.



INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

I.T. PHONE HOME

On May 5, IT migrated most of its phone numbers to a new service provider. The initiative will benefit the City of Pomona by modernizing our telephony infrastructure to be more resilient and ready to leverage cloud services in the future. Besides modernization and resiliency, IT anticipates savings of up to \$50,000 per year once all phone numbers have been ported over. The expected savings stems primarily from migrating off of legacy copper wire services and on to fiber. The cost of copper-based services has increased recently as the telecom industry is transitioning to fiber as a standard. Stay dialed in for more updates!

HARDWARE REFRESH UPDATE


Continuing with IT's computer refresh efforts, since our last update on April 20th, the team has deployed another 30 computing devices to various departments. Routine replacement and upgrade of computers is necessary for cybersecurity reasons and to ensure equipment is on par with the processing needs of modern software applications.

Additionally, PDIT recently upgraded Police Department's video server, expanded storage, and replaced 180 body-worn cameras that are now wireless and in high-definition.

FREE FOOD WASTE COLLECTION PAILS AVAILABLE: MAY $\mathbf{22}^{ND}$ THROUGH MAY $\mathbf{25}^{TH}$

The Pomona Public Works Department is offering a <u>free kitchen pail for residents</u> to make it easier to store food scraps until your disposal collection day. The pail should be used to transport and empty the collected food and food-soiled paper into the larger green organics container; these pails are <u>not</u> be placed at the curb for collection.



Organics recycling is required for Pomona residents and commercial businesses under California's new law, SB 1383. Organics include all food scraps, food-soiled paper, and

landscape materials. Organic material should be placed loosely in the green container, along with yard waste, such as grass, leaves, and branches. The Public Works Department is pleased to announce the first of two free compost giveaway events on Saturday, May 20, 2023 from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Composting reduces waste, makes us less dependent on landfills, and decreases greenhouse gas emissions.

This self-served event will take place at the City Yard located at 636 W. Monterey Ave. Residents will be limited to four 32-gallon containers of material. Residents are encouraged to bring durable containers, shovels, and gloves. The giveaway is on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Access to running water is essential to keep your family safe and healthy. The Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) may pay down your outstanding water and wastewater bills to help you find a fresh start.

The City has been enrolled in the California Department of Community Services & Development LIHWAP since June of 2022. The program is a federally funded program that offers low-income households a one-time payment (up to \$2,000) to help pay outstanding bills for residential water or wastewater costs.

Since the program launched last summer, 128 Pomona customers have applied for assistance, and their accounts have been paid in full, totaling \$144,937.
