

### **COMMUNITY SERVICES**

### "THANK YOU" TO OUTGOING YOUTH COMMISSIONERS

In 2020, the Mayor and City Council prioritized the reestablishment of a Youth Commission to ensure that youth, who make up 27% of Pomona residents, are represented and have an equitable voice. The purpose of a Youth Commission is to provide a youth-oriented point of view to City Council about issues that are important to youth, make recommendations on how to address these issues, and to foster and maintain a positive, supportive environment for all youth living in Pomona.

The City would like to thank Youth Commissioners Natalie Alvarado (Mayoral Appointee), Mario Portillo (D-4), and Joseph Santhosh (D-5) for their service to the residents of Pomona. Their last meeting will be June 1, 2023. Commissioners Alvarado and Portillo both joined the Youth Commission in September 2020, at a time when public meetings were held via teleconference. They were appointed a two-year term and then re-appointed for a second two-year term by their respective Councilmembers. Commissioner Santhosh joined the Youth Commission in August 2021. All three Youth Commissioners are graduating high school. City staff sends their best wishes to Natalie Alvarado, Mario Portillo, and Joseph Santhosh in the next chapter of their lives and thanks them for their public service.

### TRI-CITY AWARDS FUNDING FOR YOUTH TOLERANCE PROJECT

Tri-City Mental Health Services, through its Community Wellbeing Grant Program funds projects to organizations that improve the well-being of its community members. Community Services was awarded funding for Compassion 101: (Re) Connecting to Our Humanity, a project aimed at creating a more compassionate community by centering on practices and principles to improve acceptance, value differences, examine common beliefs, inspire action, and create future leaders to respond with compassion and courage. The project will serve youth, ages 7-17, providing the opportunity to participate in monthly workshops that will focus on age-appropriate topics and discussions on race, culture, religion, tolerance, empathy, acceptance, and compassion. Teens will have the opportunity to engage in an intensive one-day workshop accompanied with a field trip to a holocaust museum. Lastly, project participants will have the opportunity to design, plan, and administer a Human Library. A Human Library uses the library analogy of lending people rather than books to challenge stereotypes and prejudices through dialogue. The project is scheduled to begin August 2023 through May 2024.

#### DELEGATES ATTEND MODEL UNITED NATIONS SO-CAL SUMMIT

The City and YMCA of Orange County concluded Pomona's local chapter of Model United Nations at the So-Cal Summit on Friday, May 19, 2023 through Sunday, May 21, 2023 at Pali Mountain Camp Grounds. The culminating event allowed middle school delegates to highlight different policy counters and viewpoints based on the country they were assigned. Delegates presented and disputed with their counterparts, strategically broke down points, and highlighted weaknesses to win motions that were presented by

the advisors. Community Services is committed to strengthening and establishing partnerships to invest in the growth, leadership development, and civic engagement of Pomona's youth. ### I.T. DITCHES OLD SWITCHES

Back in January, the IT Department kicked off an effort to modernize our network infrastructure by replacing 28 outdated switches. As of this week, we have replaced another 3 switches for a total of 16 switches. We remain on track to replace the remaining switches in the Fall. This modernization effort will benefit the City of Pomona by strengthening our cybersecurity posture and improve overall network performance.

### <u>CITY OF POMONA RENT STABILIZATION INFORMATION IS NOW</u> AVAILABLE

On August 1, 2022, the City of Pomona adopted Urgency Ordinance 4320, and subsequently on April 17, 2023 adopted Ordinance 4329, establishing rent stabilization measures within the City of Pomona. The City Council adopted the Ordinance to create local tenant protections to ensure that residents of covered rental units were not faced with increased rate hikes, eviction notices or possibly becoming homeless.

The Ordinance applies to rental units built on or before February 1, 1995, unless an exemption applies. The Ordinance limits residential rent increase to no more than 4% or the change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI), whichever is lower. Only one rent increase is allowed in a 12-month period, and it cannot exceed the allowable rent increase in effect for that period.

The Ordinance also includes eviction controls based on For Cause or No Fault tenancy termination, which limits the allowed reasons for which a renter can be evicted or have their tenancy terminated.

In addition, the Rent Stabilization web page hosts user-friendly information for both tenants and rental property owners, including answers to Frequently Asked Questions.

### **POLICE**

### CLICK IT OR TICKET CAMPAIGN- MAY 22-JUNE 4, 2023

Just in time for Memorial Day weekend, the unofficial start of the summer season, this year's *Click It or Ticket* campaign will run from May 22-June 4, 2023. During this time, the department will have additional officers on patrol actively looking for drivers and passengers who are not wearing a seat belt, including children who are not secured in child safety seats.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, nearly 12,000 people killed in crashes throughout the country in 2021 were not wearing seat belts. In California, 756 people killed in crashes in 2020 were not wearing seat belts, or nearly 20 percent of all traffic deaths statewide.

California law requires a child to be secured in a safety or booster seat until they are at least 8 years old or at least 4 feet, 9 inches tall. Children under the age of 2 must ride in a rear-facing seat unless the child weighs 40 or more pounds or is 40 or more inches tall.

Funding for this program was provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

The Pomona Police Department reminds everyone taking a trip over the Memorial Day weekend to buckle up and keep children in child safety seats. Be safe!

#### OFFICER DANIEL TORRES JOINS POMONA POLICE DEPARTMENT

### AMERICAN PUBLIC WORKS ASSOCIATION COURSE COMPLETED-CONGRATULATIONS TO MATT PILARZ, PRINCIPAL CIVIL ENGINEER



The Public Works Institute helps develop public works leaders in local, county, and transportation agencies in Southern California. The four-module program offers basic and advanced public works supervisory and management skills as part of the workshop. More than sixty topics are covered in the course, including public relations, team development, conflict management, ethics, contracting and bidding, recruiting, retention, time management, finances and budgeting, solid waste and fleet management regulatory processes, strategic planning, leadership core competencies, negotiation skills, and many others.



The Public Works' Engineering Division is proud to have one of our first Public Works professionals complete the APWA course. Matt Pilarz, Principal Civil Engineer in the Public Works Department, has worked for the City for nineteen years, including two years as the Interim City Engineer. designs, performs development plan checking, oversees Public Works inspections, and provides staff management. As a Civil Engineer, Mr. Pilarz has overseen many emergency projects including buildings, sanitary sewer pump stations and bus shelters and transit facilities, street and alley paving rehabilitation projects, and many varied and unique park projects. What stood out from the American Public Works Association Public Works Institute course for Mr. Pilarz was the wide variety of

interesting matters involved with Public Works, including street paving, solid waste and fleet operations, emergency disaster response, utilities, facilities, transit, and more.

In addition to providing public works professionals with the skills they need to lead in the public works environment, the course offers peer recognition, promotions, and a leadership and management credentialing program.


