FINANCE

CITY OF POMONA'S PENSION OBLIGATION BONDS RATING OUTLOOK TO A+ POSITIVE FROM A+ STABLE

The City has recently achieved an increased credit rating from [Fitch Ratings](#) which affirms the City's Pension Obligation Bonds rating outlook to **A+ Positive** from A+ Stable. The enhanced credit rating indicates a significant milestone due to prudent financial management by the Pomona City Council and staff. Likewise, it reflects continued strong fiscal performance and potential for improved fiscal resilience based on the City's

new Fund Balance Policy. The upgraded credit rating has numerous advantages for the City and its residents. It reflects the increased confidence of external investors in the City's financial stability and creditworthiness. The rating improvements looks favorably in the financial market, resulting in lower borrowing costs for future infrastructure projects and other initiatives that will benefit our community and improve the quality of life for our residents. We recognize that the improvement in credit rating is not merely a validation of the City's past accomplishments, but a catalyst for even greater success in the future. We will continue to prioritize sound financial practices and transparency to sustain and further improve our creditworthiness.

This commitment by the Mayor and City Council to financial stewardship paved the way for this recognition and this momentum will only help propel the City of Pomona towards a brighter future.

BUSINESS RENTAL ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM

The City of Pomona values our local businesses, and soon the Business Rental Assistance Grant Program will be provided as part of the City's COVID-19 recovery efforts via funding from the American Rescue Plan (ARP) to support businesses and foster a stronger economy for our community.

The application period for the program will be August 1, 2023 - August 31, 2023. The eligibility requirements are as follows:

- Eligible businesses must be located within incorporated Pomona
- The program is only for brick-and-mortar and profit businesses in operation prior to March 16, 2020, with fewer than 25 employees
- The business must lease/rent their commercial property directly from a landlord
- The business must demonstrate a delinquency in rent payments at any time from March 16, 2020, to December 31, 2022
- The business must demonstrate a reduction in workforce and/or revenue loss from March 16, 2020, to December 31, 2022
- Corporate-owned chains or franchises, investment and insurance companies, and commercial and residential landlords, are not eligible for the grant program

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

I.T. DITCHES MORE SWITCHES

The IT Department is continuing its effort to modernize our network infrastructure by replacing outdated network switches. As of this week, we have replaced another three network switches for a total of 19 out of 28. We remain on track to replace the remaining network switches in Fall. This modernization effort will benefit the City of Pomona by strengthening our cybersecurity posture and improving overall network performance.

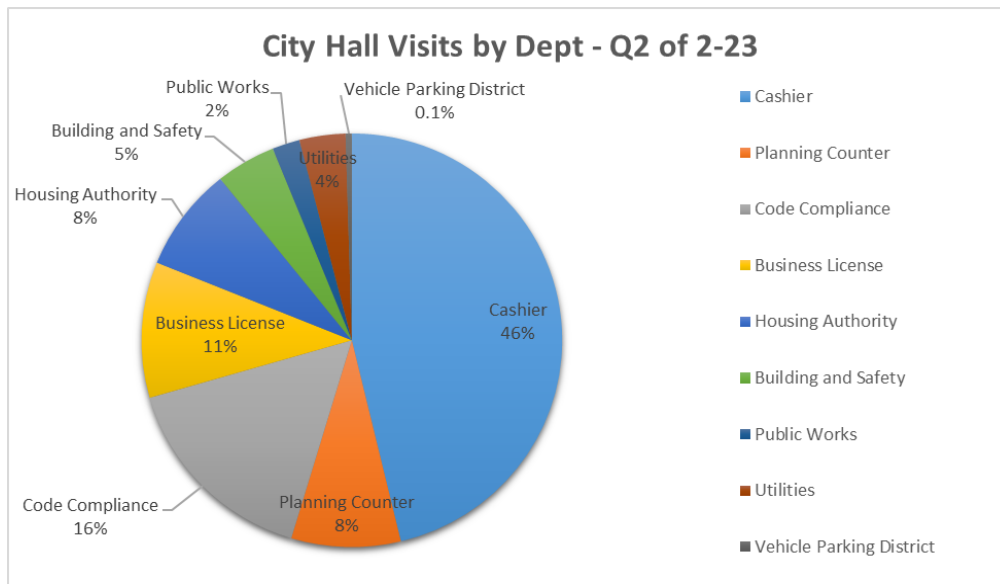
UPS AND DOWNS

This week, IT will be installing two UPS (Uninterruptible Power Supply) units at the Library. UPS units protect IT equipment from power spikes, power surges, and power outages to prolong the life of IT equipment. These new UPS units also have notification features to alert IT when it detects a power outage for staff to gracefully shut down affected equipment and avoid damage.

The City of Pomona captures data analytics to understand how the community use the services offered at City Hall. Below are statistics and highlights of the 1st quarter of 2023:

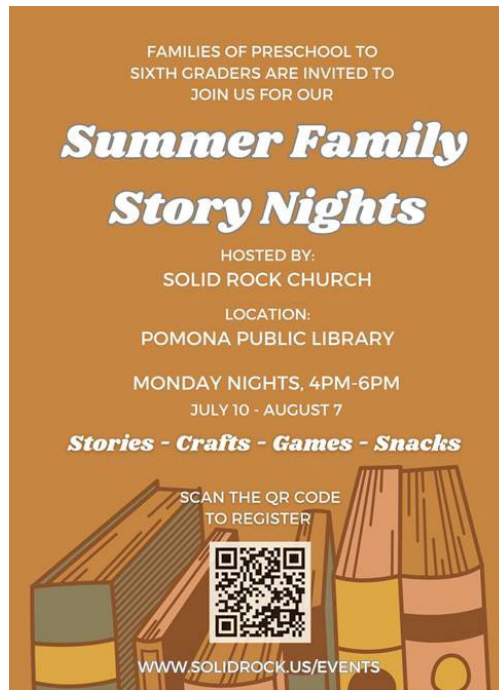
- Served 15,214 visitors, +10% compared to Q1.

SERGEANT JESSE CARDENAS HONORED BY ASSEMBLYMEMBER FREDDIE RODRIGUEZ

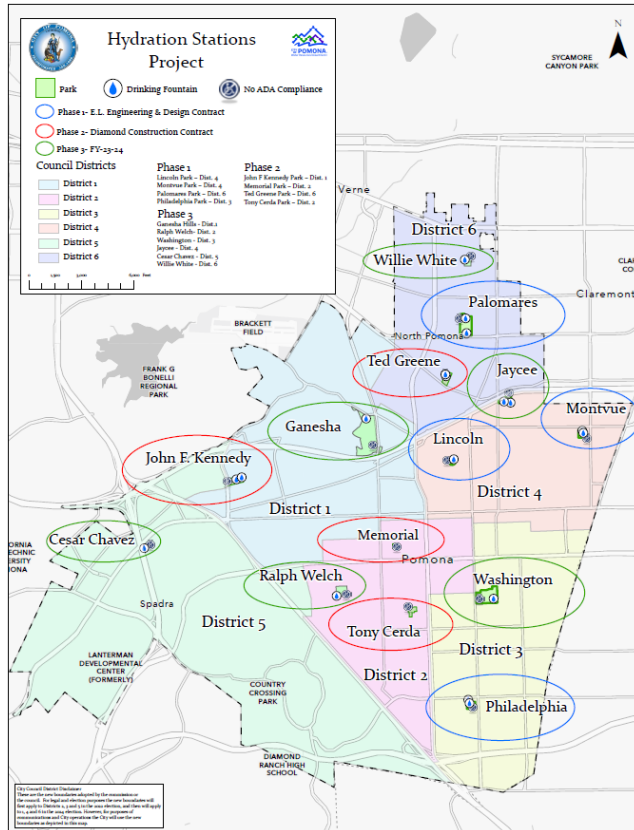

HYDRATION STATIONS UPGRADE PROJECT – RIBBON CUTTING CEREMONY
