KEEPING E-MAIL ARCHIVE ALIVE

As standard practice, IT is responsible for e-mail archival for records retention purposes. The primary system that tracks the ins and outs of e-mails recently reached end-of-life (EOL) and in need of replacement. To ensure continued and proper record keeping and for cybersecurity reasons, the archive system was successfully replaced and data migrated.

SSL'ING WELL

Secure Sockets Layer (or SSL) certificate is a digital certificate used to authenticate a website's entity and to encrypt traffic between the client machine and the web server. In the last couple of weeks, IT deployed our renewed certificate to 20 servers to ensure visits to our websites and other services remain trusted and secure.

BROADBAND STUDY


The San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG) is conducting an internet availability study to understand where affordable and reliable internet may be lacking in the region. We encourage all Pomona residents to contribute to the study by filling out the survey at https://www.sgvcog.org/broadband. The City of Pomona IT is continuing to collaborate with SGVCOG to assess internet needs in the region as mutual support is expected as recipients of CPUC's Local Agency Technical Assistant (LATA) grant. The IT

Team is drafting an RFP (Request for Proposal) for local broadband studies on accessibility, availability, and affordability challenges. Further, feasibility study and costs assessment will be included on overcoming or lessening those challenges.

PUBLIC WORKS

METROLINK NIGHT AND WEEKEND RAILROAD TIE REPLACEMENT WORK IN THE CITY OF POMONA

To ensure safety and reliability, and the efficient operation of Metrolink trains, Metrolink crews will be replacing railroad ties on their San Bernardino line between the cities of Pomona and San Bernardino. Crews will begin to bring in material for this replacement on Monday, October 2. Work will begin on Monday, October 9, 2023 through Friday, November 17, 2023 from the hours of 11 PM to 7 AM.



During this maintenance work, Metrolink is anticipating the following impacts:

- Noise and dust from construction machinery and activities
- Lights from light towers and/or on-track equipment Schedule is subject to change due to weather or unforeseen circumstances.

ROUNDABOUTS AND ATP CYCLE 4 GRANT PROJECT COVER

An exciting new project will be constructed in the City primarily during the summers of 2024 and 2025 that will create at least three (3) new roundabouts, and possibly a fourth! The City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) project, "Pomona Multi-Neighborhood Pedestrian and Bicycle Improvements," Project No. 428-67930, received a nearly \$10M Active Transportation Program Cycle 4 (ATP C4) grant to help fund these roundabouts & other bicycle and pedestrian improvements shown in the attachments.


Roundabouts provide traffic control and traffic calming at intersections of streets, and typically without the need for traffic signals or traffic stop signs. They also reduce the severity of crashes by eliminating potential head-on and broadside collisions. By allowing traffic to keep moving, and only yield to pedestrians and other vehicles when necessary, roundabouts are a great way to allow multi-modal (vehicular, pedestrian, and bicycle) traffic to get where they are going in an efficient manner.

When approaching a roundabout, vehicular drivers need to slow down and be alert; however, vehicles typically only need to yield if there is a pedestrian crossing or if there is other vehicular or bicycle traffic already in the roundabout and approaching the incoming traffic. If there are no pedestrians crossing and there is no other approaching vehicular or bicycle traffic already in the roundabout, then the incoming traffic may proceed through the roundabout without yielding.

Traffic entering a roundabout is guided to enter by turning to the right, and traffic islands, signage, and the design of the entryways help drivers recognize which way to go. Drivers entering a roundabout shall pay particular attention to any traffic already in the roundabout that is approaching from the left, and they must yield to this approaching traffic. Once in a roundabout, traffic proceeds in a counter-clockwise pattern (if viewed from above). Traffic may proceed in a circular pattern through a roundabout until their desired exit street is reached, at which point drivers again turn right to exit a roundabout, again yielding for pedestrians, and proceed on their way. Getting comfortable using roundabouts can take some time and should be expected, so please be patient getting familiar with them. Please see attachments for more information.

The City will be bidding this project for construction in the next several months. The actual construction needs to wait until the summers of 2024 and 2025 due to the close proximity of construction to various schools. Locating this project near schools helped the City obtain the nearly \$10M ATP C4 grant to fund these improvements.
