INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

CYBERSECURITY UPDATE

IT deployed a new e-mail quarantine feature to City staff this week that places potentially malicious e-mails in a virtual holding area for staff to review, assess, and release if determined to be relevant and safe. This new feature strikes a balance between cybersecurity and practicality to minimize disruption to City staff's work while adding an extra layer of protection. Additionally, the City's Private Branch Exchange (PBX) telephone system was updated to the latest version last week. The system upgrade addressed various vulnerabilities and bugs to keep the IT infrastructure safe. Stay tune for more updates as IT continues to work on protecting the City's digital assets!

TAKING A DIGITAL LOOK - Q3 of 2023

BROADBAND STUDY

The San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG) is conducting an internet availability study to understand where affordable and reliable internet may be lacking in

the region. We encourage all Pomona residents to contribute to the study by filling out the survey at https://www.sgvcog.org/broadband. The City of Pomona IT is continuing to collaborate with SGVCOG to assess internet needs in the region as mutual support is expected as recipients of CPUC's Local Agency Technical Assistant (LATA) grant. The IT Team is drafting an RFP (Request for Proposal) for local broadband studies on accessibility, availability, and affordability challenges. Further, feasibility study and costs assessment will be included on overcoming or lessening those challenges.
