## INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

#### LATEST GIS PARCEL DATA

The IT Department's GIS (Geographic Information System) team successfully processed the Los Angeles County Assessor's latest data and updated the City's assessment records for all real and personal property (known as the Secured Basic File Abstract). One of the many functions of the GIS team is to maintain land parcel data in the City's Enterprise GIS database which is used by various applications including our enterprise permitting application, address mailer, and custom GIS utilities used by City staff.

# INFRASTRUCTURE UPDATES

Continuing with IT's commitment of securing our digital infrastructure, the IT team updated the firmware of all of the City's 16 firewalls to be on the latest version. Firmware is essentially a type of software that bridges communication between the hardware and the software interfaced by users via basic machine instructions. With cybersecurity threats on the rise, it is important that we stay vigilant and diligent in keeping the City's digital infrastructure up to date.

#### PREPARING FOR NEXT GENERATION

This week, PDIT worked closely with PD to prepare for the eventual upgrade of the 911 system known as Next Generation 911 (NG911). A new audio record server was configured and deployed for this initiative so that 911 calls and dispatch radio traffic can be captured once the new system is adopted. Stay tuned for more updates on how IT is collaborating with other departments to launch the City of Pomona forward!

#### **BROADBAND STUDY**

The San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG) is conducting an internet availability study to understand where affordable and reliable internet may be lacking in the region. We encourage all Pomona residents and businesses to contribute to the study by filling out the survey at <a href="https://www.sgvcog.org/broadband">https://www.sgvcog.org/broadband</a>. The City of Pomona IT's team is continuing to collaborate with SGVCOG to assess internet needs in the region as mutual support is expected as recipients of CPUC's Local Agency Technical Assistant (LATA) grant.

#### POMONA POLICE DEPARTMENT SPOOKTACULAR EVENT



## CONFLUENCE CHOKEPOINT RELIEF PROJECT CLOSURES SR-60/SR-57

The Confluence Chokepoint Relief Project (Project) will help to improve congestion at the State Route 57 (SR-57) and State Route 60 (SR-60) area of confluence between the City of Diamond Bar and the City of Industry. Contractors will be working on the eastbound SR-60 and northbound SR-57, and the Grand Ave. and Diamond Bar Blvd. ramps will experience closures.


The SR-60/SR-57 interchange will also experience nighttime closures. Lanes on both freeways near the interchange, and on Grand Ave., may experience intermittent closures throughout the night starting on Monday, October 30, 2023 at 7 p.m. until Saturday, November 4, 2023 at 6 a.m. Grand Ave. and the SR-60 and SR-57 will remain open during the intermittent lane closures. Residents and businesses located near the construction activity are advised to anticipate noise, dust, and vibrations associated with construction activities.

The impacts of this Project's construction in the City of Pomona will be vehicles detouring off the eastbound SR-60 at Diamond Bar Blvd. and traveling through the City to get back onto the eastbound SR-60. It is anticipated that vehicles will be directed back to the SR-60 via Diamond Bar Blvd./Mission Blvd. and the SR-71.

## COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP PROGRAMS (CPP) GRANT

The Water Resources Department (WRD) has received a \$3,000 grant from the Metropolitan Water District (MWD) through the Community Partnership Program. These funds will be used to support the upcoming Native Plant Program which is scheduled to start this fall. The program aims to encourage the use of native plants in

landscaping, which helps to conserve water, promote biodiversity, and supports our local ecosystem. We are proud to work with a local nursery and build strong partnerships within our community.

Our Native Plant Program is just the beginning. We also offer free landscape classes to empower homeowners with skills and knowledge to create water-efficient and eco-friendly landscapes. Our programs serve Pomona residents who are passionate about sustainable landscaping. We focus on water conservation, native plants, and responsible landscaping. Our efforts reduce water usage, mitigate the urban heat island



effect, and enhance water reliability. We collaborate with the local nursery and integrate with the city's landscape program to promote sustainable water management and environmental awareness in Pomona.
