INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

NEW YEAR, NEW DEPLOYMENT

To ensure City staff is equipped with PCs that can handle their workload, IT recently deployed 16 new computers to Community Services and Development Services Departments. IT took the opportunity to also right-size the equipment for staff by issuing a form factor that is most appropriate for their needs, e.g. rugged devices for field use, laptops for portability, and high-performing desktops for resource-intensive processes. Check back for more updates as IT works on refreshing our fleet of PCs!

FIRSTNET DEPLOYMENT

Several weeks ago, PDIT coordinated with PD to pilot mobile devices on the FirstNet cellular network. After rigorous testing and validation on FirstNet and the City's new Mobile Device Management (MDM) solution, PDIT deployed another 18 devices to PD Patrol Officers with more deployments to follow. With the FirstNet network designed to be exclusively for first-responders, this segregation allows first-responders to have more reliable connectivity that is not impacted by the general public's cellular traffic.

BROADBAND STUDY

The San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG) is conducting an internet availability study to understand where affordable and reliable internet may be lacking in the region. We encourage all Pomona residents to contribute to the study by filling out the survey at https://www.sgvcog.org/broadband. The City of Pomona IT is continuing to collaborate with SGVCOG to assess internet needs in the region as mutual support is expected as recipients of CPUC's Local Agency Technical Assistant (LATA) grant.

CROCHET WITH US!



PROJECT SR-60 EVENING CLOSURES


The Confluence Chokepoint Relief Project (Project) will help to improve congestion at the State Route 57 (SR-57) and State Route 60 (SR-60) area of confluence between the City of Diamond Bar and the City of Industry. The SR-60 Grand Ave. and Diamond Bar Blvd. (eastbound and westbound) on- and off-ramps will experience closures during this time.

The impacts of this Project's construction in the City of Pomona will be vehicles detouring off the eastbound SR-60 at Diamond Bar Blvd. and traveling through the City to get back onto the eastbound SR-60. It is anticipated that vehicles will be directed back to the SR-60 via Diamond Bar Blvd./Mission Blvd. and the SR-71.
