#### PROJECT SR-60 EVENING CLOSURES


The Confluence Chokepoint Relief Project (Project) will help to improve congestion at the State Route 57 (SR-57) and State Route 60 (SR-60) area of confluence between the City of Diamond Bar and the City of Industry. The westbound SR-60 Grand Ave. and Diamond Bar Blvd. on- and off-ramps will experience evening closures.

The impacts of this Project's construction in the City of Pomona will be vehicles detouring off the eastbound SR-60 at Diamond Bar Blvd. and traveling through the City to get back onto the eastbound SR-60. It is anticipated that vehicles will be directed back to the SR-60 via Diamond Bar Blvd./Mission Blvd. and the SR-71.

With the recent closure of the Foothill Transit Store at the Downtown Transit Center, City Hall is now the new location for the purchase of discounted Get About and Metrolink tickets. Get About ticket booklets can be purchased at a 50% discount from the website price. Sales are still limited to two discounted books per person per month.



Beginning January 25, 2024, you can also purchase discounted monthly Metrolink passes at 50% off the regular price. Prior to January 25, Pomona residents can purchase

these discounted passes at the West Covina Transit Store located at 100 South Vincent Avenue, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor, West Covina. Limit is one



monthly pass per person, per month. Full price passes are available online and at Metrolink kiosks.
