## ***INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY***

### **INTERNET @ FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER**

In preparation for the opening of the Family Resource Center, the IT Team successfully configured and deployed internet at this new facility. While there is more work to be done, IT staff can now monitor and test internet quality and reliability to verify optimal configuration. The network configuration allows access to the City's network by Staff and general internet use by guests and visitors.

### **DIGITIZING RIP A REPORTS**

The Police Department Information Technology team (PDIT) successfully deployed a RIPA solution to PD's mobile phones and mobile data terminals (MDTs). RIPA (Racial and Identity Profiling Act) requires law enforcement to collect perceived demographic and other information regarding pedestrian and traffic stops. By implementing a digital RIPA solution, officers will be able to submit reports promptly while out in the field with more efficiency and accuracy.

### **WEBSITE FEEDBACK**

The City's website, <https://pomonaca.gov>, is undergoing updates to improve accessibility by following Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG). Our objective is to create an inclusive digital space that accommodates all visitors, including those with disabilities. Although many improvements have been made in the past weeks, we are still working to identify and address any accessibility shortcomings.

IT recently deployed a feedback feature on the City's website to collect information about user experience. We look forward to receiving valuable information to help us improve the usability of our website. The new feature can be accessed by clicking on the "Feedback" button floating on the right side of the website. Stay tuned for more information about the new tools that IT will be deploying to improve user experience!

### **BROADBAND STUDY**

The San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG) is conducting an internet availability study to understand where affordable and reliable internet may be lacking in the region. We encourage all Pomona residents to contribute to the study by filling out the survey at <https://www.sgvkog.org/broadband>. The City of Pomona IT is continuing to collaborate with SGVCOG to assess internet needs in the region as mutual support is expected as recipients of CPUC's Local Agency Technical Assistant (LATA) grant.

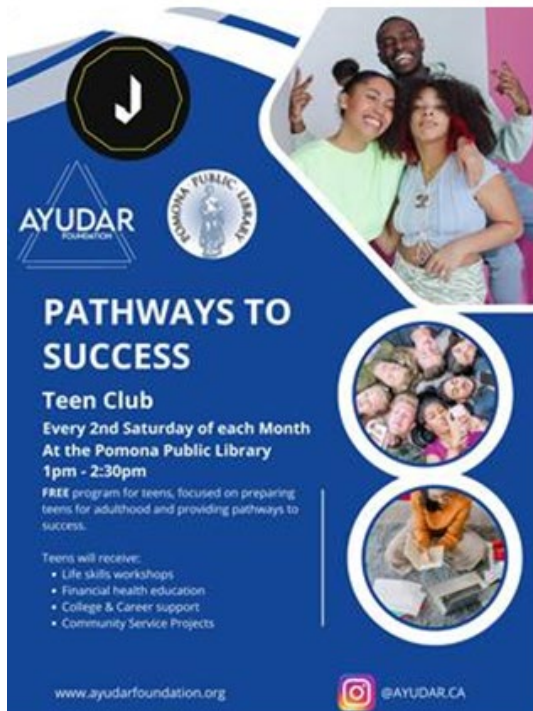

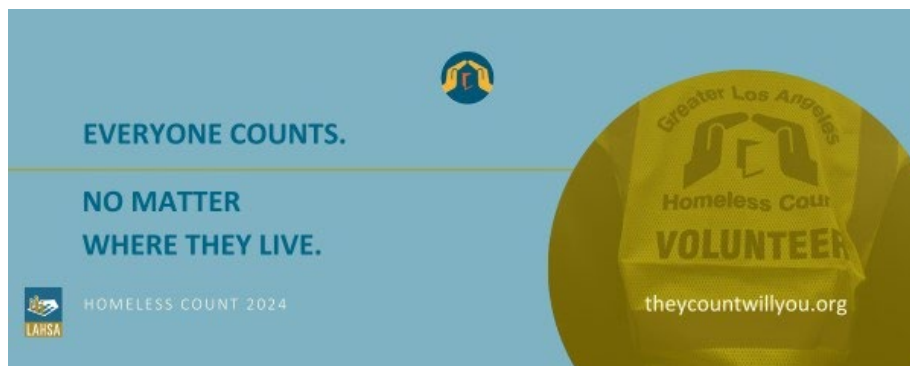
### **HOMELESS COUNT 2024**

## ***PUBLIC WORKS***

### **PROJECT SR-60 EVENING CLOSURES**

The Confluence Chokepoint Relief Project (Project) will help to improve congestion at the State Route 57 (SR-57) and State Route 60 (SR-60) area of confluence between the City of Diamond Bar and the City of Industry. The westbound SR-60 Grand Ave. and Diamond Bar Blvd. on-and off-ramps will experience evening closures. The northbound SR-57 connector to eastbound SR-60 will also experience evening closures. Golden Springs Dr. will be closed at Copley Drive during the day.

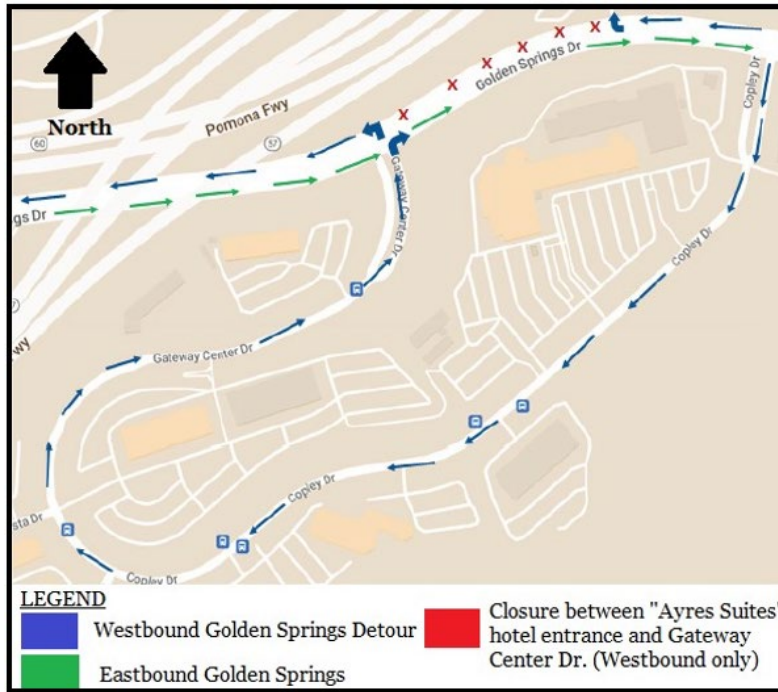
The impacts of this Project's construction in the City of Pomona will be vehicles detouring off the eastbound SR-60 at Diamond Bar Blvd. and traveling through the City to get back onto the eastbound SR-60. It is anticipated that vehicles will be directed back to the SR-60 via Diamond Bar Blvd./Mission Blvd. and the SR-71.

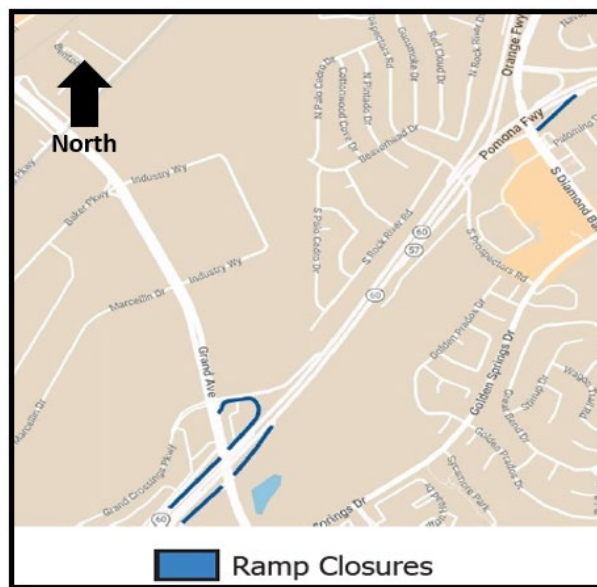

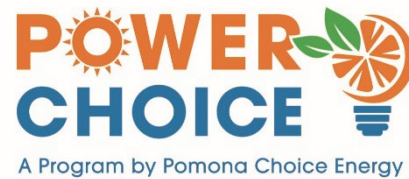


