DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

ART IN PUBLIC PLACES BI-ANNUAL FUNDING

On January 22, 2024, the Cultural Arts Commission approved the creation of the Art in Public Places Bi-Annual Funding. The Art in Public Places Bi-Annual Funding would be distinguished by two cycles — an Open Call and a Targeted Call. The Open Call is for artists of all ages living anywhere and any non-profit organization located anywhere interested in producing public art in the City of Pomona. The Targeted Call will place emphasis on a chosen topic by the Cultural Arts Commission, with a concentrated focus on the Commission's Action Plan 2020-2025, that may have more requirements for applicants to meet (i.e. Specific site projects, Youth-oriented programs, etc.). Each Call will have detailed information regarding Letter of Inquiry and Application requirements that is supported with applicant workshops before each deadline.

MAINTENANCE OF PUBLIC ARTWORK

On January 22, 2024, the Cultural Arts Commission has approved \$50,000 for the maintenance of our Public Art collection this year. CALL FOR VISUAL ARTS

In March 2022, the City launched a Call for Visual Arts that highlighted locations in the Parks. This call receive many applications, and by May 2023 the Cultural Arts Commission had approved 53 artwork projects. Last year, began a tremendous push for art in our City, and we aren't done! There are still many artists completing their projects from this 2022 Call.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

POMONA IN HIGH DEFINITION

The City of Pomona has gone High Definition (HD)! You can now watch City Council meetings clearly in HD from the comfort of your home. The City of Pomona's broadcasting partner, Spectrum, will deliver City Council meetings in HD on Channel 1301. The existing Channel 29 will remain in service and keep its current Standard Definition (SD). Besides a visual improvement, the new HD channel supports Secondary Audio Programming (SAP) and Closed Captioning (CC). Both SAP and CC features are now undergoing configuration and tests. In the near future, the City of Pomona will deliver Spanish audio and closed captioning over cable TV and web stream. Stay "tuned-in" for more updates!

CYBERSECURITY UPDATE

For the past few weeks, IT successfully decommissioned four servers (two administration, one application, and one file server) that were approaching end-of-life (EOL). EOL equipment is a risk to the IT infrastructure because they are no longer patched by manufacturers. As a result, EOL equipment allows bad actors to leverage unpatched vulnerabilities to breach IT systems and environments. Check back to see what else IT is doing to safeguard our digital infrastructure.

WEBSITE FEEDBACK

IT recently deployed a feedback feature on the City's website to collect information about user experience. We look forward to receiving valuable information from our visitors to help us improve the usability of our website. The new feature can be accessed by clicking on the "Feedback" button floating on the right side of the website.

BROADBAND STUDY

The San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG) is conducting an internet availability study to understand where affordable and reliable internet may be lacking in the region. We encourage all Pomona residents to contribute to the study by filling out the survey at https://www.sgvcog.org/broadband. The City of Pomona IT is continuing to collaborate with SGVCOG to assess internet needs in the region as mutual support is expected as recipients of CPUC's Local Agency Technical Assistant (LATA) grant.


PROJECT SR-60 EVENING CLOSURES

The Confluence Chokepoint Relief Project (Project) will help to improve congestion at the State Route 57 (SR-57) and State Route 60 (SR-60) area of confluence between the City of Diamond Bar and the City of Industry. The eastbound and westbound SR-60 Grand Ave. ramps and the eastbound Diamond Bar Blvd. on-ramp will experience closures. Additionally, westbound Golden Springs Dr. will be closed at Copley Dr. during the day.

The impacts of this Project's construction in the City of Pomona will be vehicles detouring off the eastbound SR-60 at Diamond Bar Blvd. and traveling through the City to get back onto the eastbound SR-60. It is anticipated that vehicles will be directed back to the SR-60 via Diamond Bar Blvd./Mission Blvd. and the SR-71.


Golden Springs Circulation (Map →):
