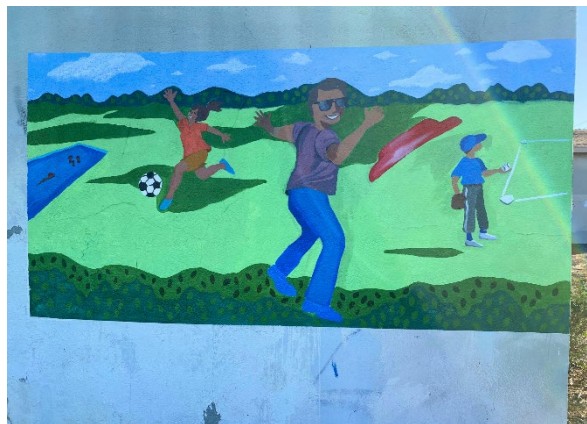

## ***INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY***

### **CYBERSECURITY UPDATE**

Continuing with our efforts to migrate applications to new servers running on a modern operating system, IT successfully migrated and updated another server used by Neighborhood Services that hosts three different applications. General upkeep of server operating systems strengthens the City's cybersecurity posture by ensuring we utilize software still in support by vendors especially with security patches. On to the next server!

### **UPS DEPLOYMENT**

Last week, IT successfully deployed five UPS (Uninterruptible Power Supply) units to City Hall and one to City Yard to replace aging units. UPS units protect IT equipment from power spikes, power brown outs, and power outages to prolong the life of IT equipment. Additionally, all new UPS units are configured to alert IT when it detects a power outage for staff to gracefully shut down affected equipment and avoid damage.

### POLICE DEPARTMENT STATION TOUR WITH POMONA CATHOLIC H.S.

On February 21, 2024 our Community Programs Unit hosted 19 students from Pomona Catholic High School. 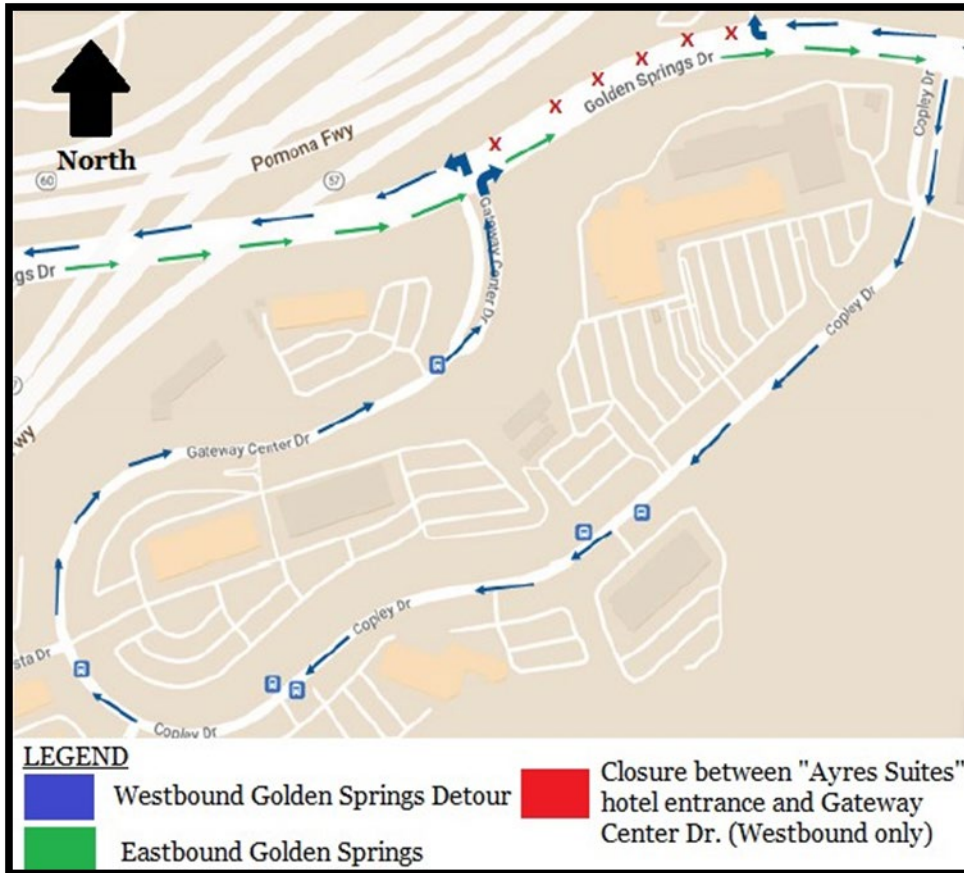
#### **CONFLUENCE CHOKEPOINT RELIEF PROJECT SR-60 CLOSURE**

The Confluence Chokepoint Relief Project (Project) will help to improve congestion at the State Route 57 (SR-57) and State Route 60 (SR-60) area of confluence between the City of Diamond Bar and the City of Industry. During this closure, westbound Golden Springs Dr. will be closed at Copley Dr. during daytime hours. The impacts of this Project's construction in the City will be vehicles detouring off the eastbound SR-60 at



Diamond Bar Blvd. and traveling through the City to get back onto the eastbound SR-60. It is anticipated that vehicles will be directed back to the SR-60 via Diamond Bar Blvd./Mission Blvd. and the SR-71.
