2024 HIGH SCHOOL WATERCOLOR CONTEST


The City of Pomona's High School Watercolor contest is **OPEN!**





CONFLUENCE CHOKEPOINT RELIEF PROJECT SR-60 CLOSURES
The Confluence Chokepoint Relief Project (Project) will help to improve congestion at
the State Route 57 (SR-57) and State Route 60 (SR-60) area of confluence between the
City of Diamond Bar and the City of Industry. Golden Springs Dr. will be closed at
Copley Dr. during daytime hours (See Map A below). The eastbound SR-60 Diamond
Bar Blvd. off- and on-ramps will be closed overnight (See Map B below). The
northbound SR-57 connector to eastbound SR-60 will also experience closures (See Map
C below).


The impacts of this Project's construction in the City of Pomona will be vehicles detouring off the eastbound SR-60 at Diamond Bar Blvd. and traveling through the City to get back onto the eastbound SR-60. It is anticipated that vehicles will be directed back to the SR-60 via Diamond Bar Blvd./Mission Blvd. and the SR-71.



WATER RESOURCES

UNDERDRAIN REPAIR AT WEST ORANGE GROVE AVENUE AND NORTH WHITE AVENUE

On March 11, a damaged 6'x1' storm underdrain was repaired at the northwest corner of Orange Grove Avenue and White Avenue. The drain conveys runoff along West Orange Grove Avenue across North White Avenue. The repaired segment is beneath the sidewalk located northwest of the intersection. The City executed a closed circuit television (CCTV) video inspection, cleaning, and field assessment to determine the storm drain issues. The CCTV video identified the problems with the existing drain. Staff determined the necessary repair requirements that included the removal of the damaged concrete, installation of additional steel reinforcement, and sidewalk repair.
