

CONFLUENCE CHOKEPOINT RELIEF PROJECT SR-60 CLOSURES


The Confluence Chokepoint Relief Project (Project) will help to improve congestion at the State Route 57 (SR-57) and State Route 60 (SR-60) area of confluence between the City of Diamond Bar and the City of Industry. Golden Springs Dr. will be closed at Copley Dr. during daytime hours (Map A). The eastbound SR-60 Diamond Bar Blvd. on- and off-ramps will be closed overnight (Map B). Grand Ave on- and off-ramps will be closed overnight (Map C).

The impacts of this Project's construction in the City of Pomona will be vehicles detouring off the eastbound SR-60 at Diamond Bar Blvd. and traveling through the City to get back onto the eastbound SR-60. It is anticipated that vehicles will be directed back to the SR-60 via Diamond Bar Blvd./Mission Blvd. and the SR-71.

SCHEDULED SR-71 FREEWAY CLOSURE

As part of the ongoing efforts to keep the roads and highways operational during the construction of the State Route 71 (SR-71) Expressway-to-Freeway Conversion Project, Caltrans will implement overnight full closures of the southbound SR-71 lanes beginning on Monday, April 8, 2024 through Tuesday, April 9, 2024 for the removal of sign structures.

Residents and businesses located near the SR-71 are advised to anticipate noise and vibrations associated with construction activities. Motorists should expect delays and are strongly advised to avoid the area and use alternate routes. Additionally, motorists can check traffic conditions before they leave by visiting the Caltrans "Quickmap": QuickMap (ca.gov)

Caltrans reminds motorists to "Be Work Zone Alert" and "Slow for the Cone Zone."

WATER RESOURCES

WRAPPED CCTV CAMERA TRUCK

The Wastewater Operations section had their CCTV truck equipped with a new wrap by Gator Wraps located in Ontario, California. The design features an illustration of a CCTV camera crawler performing a sewer pipe inspection while operated by Wastewater Division staff. The wrap also highlights one of the Division's tasks of maintaining approximately 320 miles of gravity sewer mains. It also demonstrates the various issues the camera truck operator is likely to find while video inspecting the wastewater collection's system, such as cracks or damage to the sewer main, blockages cause by roots, and blockages caused by fats, oils, grease and rags.
