#### PICKLEBALL COURTS AT PALOMARES PARK

The City and Community Services is thrilled to announce that the much anticipated pickleball courts at Palomares Park will be opening April 24<sup>th</sup> and welcoming players

of all ages and skill levels for friendly matches, skill-building sessions, and competitions. Whether you are a seasoned pickleball pro or a newbie eager to learn, these courts will provide the perfect venue to hone your skills, meet fellow players, and enjoy active fun. The existing four tennis courts were resurfaced and restriped to create hybrid sports courts. The restriping will retain the existing use of tennis courts, while creating 16 pickleball courts to enhance the many existing amenities at Palomares Park, including the athletic fields, skate park, basketball courts, playgrounds, senior center, and teen center.

Community Services will integrate pickleball recreational activities into youth, teen, and senior programming, including opportunities for intergenerational play. Join us on April 24, 2024 at 3:00 p.m., as we unveil our new courts and kick off a season of community camaraderie.




