

#### **COMMUNITY CENTERS – IT UPDATES**



# STAFF PARTICIPATES IN CAMBODIAN BUDDHIST SOCIETY'S KHMER NEW YEAR



## **PUBLIC WORKS**

#### STREET SWEEPING PROGRAM

Prior to the City's new exclusive franchise agreement with Athens beginning on July 1, 2023, Athens provided the City's street sweeping services. As you know, not all City streets are properly signed to notify residents of the day and time their street is scheduled to be swept.

With the beginning of the new exclusive franchise agreement last year, it was the Mayor and Council's direction that every street in the City be properly signed to provide for cleaner streets and community. Previously, residents would have to initiate a petition process for the City to consider installing street sweeping signs on their particular street. Now, residents will no longer have to submit a petition. To that end, Athens agreed to provide funds to the City to purchase the necessary amount of signs and posts so that every street will be signed.

City Staff and Athens have been working together over the last few months on a strategy to provide an improved street sweeping program on every street. Preliminary street sweeping routes have been identified for every neighborhood and street in the City, and over the last two weeks (April 1-April 12), Athens conducted a test run of the new, preliminary street sweeping routes to identify inefficiencies and to make sure every street could be swept within the proposed date/time window. The community was notified of this test run via the City's social media platform. During this test run, your normal street sweeping may have been affected.

The test run was completed, and as of Monday, April 15, your normal schedule for street sweeping has resumed. Enforcement of no parking on street sweeping days is back in full effect.

Now, City Staff and Athens are working on determining the total number of new signs and posts that will be needed for all of the streets Citywide. As we move closer to the implementation of the improved street sweeping program later this year, information will be provided in advance to residents through various means (i.e. bill inserts, social media, robocalls, etc.).

# SOLAR AND BATTERY 101: WHAT EXACTLY IS POMONA CHOICE ENERGY'S NEW POWER CHOICE PROGRAM



The Power Choice Program, Pomona Choice Energy's new solar and battery storage program, has officially launched and is now available for residential customers. But, what exactly is a solar battery and why is it important? How does it work and what benefits does it provide?

# What is a solar and battery storage system?

Solar panels are becoming increasingly popular as advancing technology makes them more affordable and efficient. Installing solar panels at home is a great way to produce renewable energy, reduce your carbon footprint, and

contribute to a greener future.

However, solar panels alone lack the ability to store energy. Without a battery, excess energy generated by solar panels goes to waste if not immediately used, leaving your home without power when the sun isn't shining.

#### Why is battery storage important?

Solar batteries provide a solution to this challenge. Excess energy is stored in the battery, making the energy available during times when the sun isn't shining and the system isn't generating power.

All solar and battery storage systems follow the same basic process. Whenever the sun is out, solar panels generate electricity that gets used by the home. At any given time, if the solar system is generating more energy than the home is using, the surplus energy charges the battery, storing it for future use. Once the battery is fully charged, if energy production still outweighs usage, the excess energy will be sent back through the grid to the utility and credited to the customer under Southern California Edison's current Solar Billing Plan. This ensures energy produced by the solar panels is never wasted and that residents are financially compensated for the surplus energy their system produces.

#### What are the benefits of a solar and battery system?

A solar and battery system provides a myriad of benefits to users. Of course, solar panels are the most popular and widely available energy source for those looking to reduce their carbon footprint and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

Installing a system is also a great way to save money on monthly electricity bills. Instead of being reliant on fluctuating market electricity rates tied to community demand, you can utilize the power stored in your battery during "peak hours" when electricity is most expensive. With a battery, the energy collected and stored throughout the day can be used during these peak hours, reducing your overall costs.

It also grants users a greater degree of energy independence. In the event of a blackout, an on-site solar battery can function as a backup power source, keeping the lights on even when the grid power is off. The Power Choice program gives residential customers a way to enjoy these benefits without the upfront cost of installing and owning a system.
