The Sanctuary is a five-unit, non-congregate family shelter to that will connect homeless families with children attending school in Pomona to permanent housing. SIRENS OF SILENCE EVENT

On April 13th, the Pomona Police Department partnered with the Los Angeles County Fire Department for their Sirens of Silence event held at the San Gabriel Regional Center in Pomona. This program was created to bring awareness and foster inclusivity to the growing population with special needs, especially individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). For some children with ASD, seeing a fully-suited first responder can provide a sense of uneasiness. Lights and sirens can also cause sensory overload and be overwhelming. To help familiarize and expose individuals with ASD to first responders, the Los Angeles County Fire Department hosts this Sirens of Silence event so children with ASD and their parents/caregivers can meet firefighters, police officers, and EMTs and see/touch the equipment and apparatuses in a quiet, less stimulating setting.

Caltrans reminds motorists to "Be Work Zone Alert" and "Slow for the Cone Zone."


