LA CASITA TEEN CENTER EXPANSION PROJECT COMMUNITY INPUT

In March 2023, Congresswoman Norma Torres visited the La Casita Teen Center at Palomares Park to deliver a \$4 million grant. The funding is to update and expand the existing La Casita building to create a state-of-the-art recreation facility for teens, featuring new computers, high-speed internet, and a dedicated study room. On May 22, 2024, Staff is meeting with teen program participants to obtain input and ideas to ensure it becomes a desirable center that meets the needs of Pomona. Staff will also be asking for input at the Youth Commission meeting on June 6, 2024. Pomona teens, parents, teen advocates, and youth serving organizations are encouraged to attend this meeting to share ideas for the La Casita Teen Center. TRI-CITY FUNDS HEARTFUL HANDS: EMPOWERING TEENS THROUGH SERVICE

Community Services is proud to announce that Tri-City Mental Health Services, through its 2024-25 Community Wellbeing Grant Program is funding Heartful Hands, a new project designed to tackle the challenges and barriers that teens face in accessing service-learning opportunities and community service hours. The project aims to serve 500 youth, ages 13-17, offering them valuable opportunities to develop leadership skills to become effective change agents in the community. Heartful Hands will run from August 2024 to May 2025, providing teens a blend of hands-on activities, mentoring, and community projects to their leadership, decision-making, communication, and problem-solving abilities. This initiative aligns with Community Services' commitment to delivering high-quality, meaningful recreational programming that promotes wellness and strengthens community capacity for increased social connection and mental wellbeing.

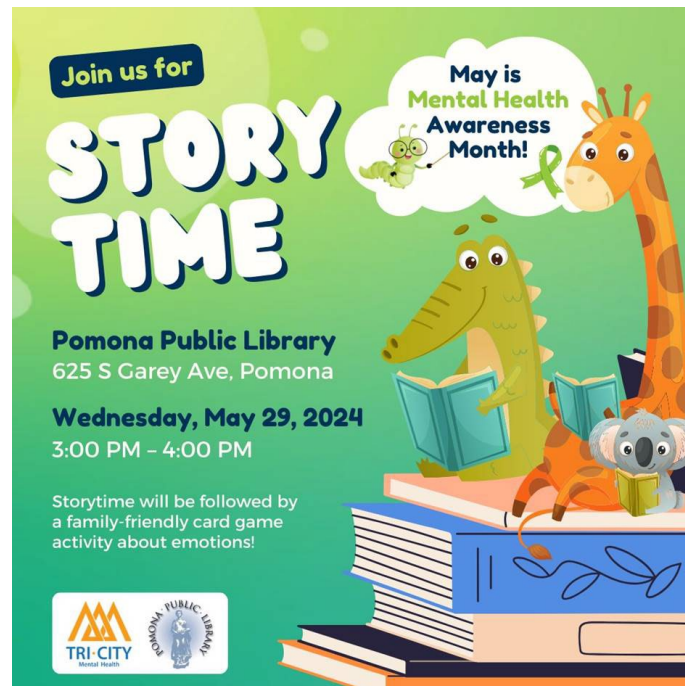
COMMUNITY CENTER WI-FI UPDATE

In total, thirteen community centers have public Wi-Fi (Ganesha, Garfield, Jaycee, Kennedy, Kiwanis, La Casita, Palomares, Philadelphia, Ralph Welch, Renacimiento, Washington, Westmont, and Willie White). Two of the bigger facilities, Ganesha and Palomares, will require additional cabling and access points to expand coverage. On May 19, 2024, Sergeant Dan Gomez graduated from the Police Officers Standards and Training (POST) Sherman Block Leadership Institute. This eight-month program is designed to stimulate personal growth, leadership, and ethical decision-making in California law enforcement front-line supervisors. Designed and implemented in 1988 through the efforts of California law enforcement professionals and top educators, this intense program is based on experiential learning techniques. Students are challenged to learn new ways to resolve issues through group and individual work. PUBLIC WORKS

FOOTHILL GOLD LINE CONSTRUCTION ALERT

As part of the 9.1-mile Foothill Gold Line light rail project, Metrolink crews will be working project wide within the railroad corridor to perform rail grinding operations. Rail grinding requires a large, specialized machine to drive along the new light rail tracks in both directions and grind the surface of the rails to their final shape. No street closures will be needed for this work, but this work is noisy and can cause vibrations. Work will begin daily from 7:00 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday, beginning Monday, May 20, intermittently through June 5.

During this work, Metrolink anticipates the following impacts:

- Noise from the rail grinder is expected. Noise and vibration will be monitored to ensure they stay below the required levels.
- Other closures may be in place for additional ongoing operations. Please safely follow all signage and any/all detour routes.
