BOLO – Liquid Fentanyl

(U//LES) HSI Seattle has seen a new trend of liquid fentanyl being transported in bulk from the southwest border into the Pacific Northwest. Recent seizures via the I-5 highway and interconnected roadways have revealed the use of 15 gallon blue containers and 50 gallon drums as seen above .

(U//LES) Additionally, The quality of the liquid fentanyl varied between colorless/odorless and blue tinted liquid and has tested positive for fentanyl using test strips. Other indicators to look for during a traffic stop may include cooking equipment, specifically hot plates and pots.

(U//LES) This bulletin is for officer safety and awareness purposes only.
