Teens heard stories from a former gang member, a former addict, an attorney, a

former United States Marine, a person with a disability, an adoptee, a first generation student, and a Latina entrepreneur. One teen said she "loved this event. It was interesting and motivating." The event was designed to empower youth to respond with love, kindness, and courage to cultivate a more compassionate community. Tri-City Mental Health Services' Community Wellbeing Grant Program funded the project.

# INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

#### **FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER**

In preparation for the opening of the Family Resource Center, the IT Team successfully configured and deployed a secured network at this facility, enabling City Staff to access network resources remotely as well as the community to access the internet via a segregated network. Additionally, six security cameras were installed around and within the premise and configured to allow remote access by staff.


#### **CYBERSECURITY UPDATE**

As the IT Team continues to work through Homeland Security's cybersecurity recommendations through CISA (Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency), we have addressed another 6 recommendations from CISA's report through updating Security Socket Layer (SSL) certificates, decommissioning of dated appliances, and upgrading servers to modern operating systems. IT staff remains focused on cybersecurity to protect the City's digital infrastructure and have completed more than 130 CISA recommendations in total since the City assumed Homeland Security's vulnerability testing services last year. Check back for more updates as we continue to heighten our cybersecurity posture.

#### SR-71 FREEWAY CONNECTOR AND ON - RAMP CLOSURES

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has announced various closures of State Route 71 (SR-71) between State Route 60 (SR-60) for Monday, June 17 through Friday, June 21 for road repair work. EXTENDED CLOSURE – The Rio Rancho on-ramp to Northbound SR-71 will be closed from June 10, 2024 through September 30, 2024 for ramp realignment. Detours will be posted.



# <u>FOOTHILL GOLD LINE CONSTRUCTION ALERT - NOISY GRINDING</u> OPERATIONS IN RAIL CORRIDOR FROM GLENDORA TO POMONA

As part of the 9.1-mile Foothill Gold Line light rail project, Metrolink crews have been working project-wide within the railroad corridor to perform rail grinding operations. Rail grinding requires a large, specialized machine to drive along the new light rail tracks in both directions and grind the surface of the rails to their final shape. No street closures will be needed for this work, but this work is noisy and can cause vibrations. Work began on Monday, May 20, and was scheduled to intermittently occur through June 5. This work has now been extended through the end of June due to crews needing to work around other ongoing activities.

During this work, Metrolink anticipates the following impacts:

- Noise from the rail grinder is expected. Noise and vibration will be monitored to ensure they stay below the required levels.
- Other closures may be in place for additional ongoing operations. Please safely follow all signage and any/all detour routes.

Please obey all posted construction signs and do not enter the construction work zone.
