PILOT PARK AMBASSADOR PROGRAM LAUNCHES

Pomona City Council approved a partnership with Just Us 4 Youth to launch a pilot Park Ambassador Program. This initiative is in response to an expressed community need and a proactive step towards having a greater presence in our parks. The goal is to enhance safety and increase the overall user experience within our City parks. To prepare Ambassadors, various City departments such as Public Works' Parks & Facilities, Community Services, Neighborhood Services, and Pomona Police Quality of Life provided a variety of trainings. Trainings that were included were to review park rules, permitting (special events, filming, fields, facilities), program offerings, events, classes, and reporting (maintenance, criminal activity, graffiti, etc.). The ambassadors also toured Hope 4 Home to learn first-hand about services offered for the unhoused.

Park Ambassadors will be activated seven days a week and will make rounds to 14 City parks. The ambassadors will travel in teams of two and will be identifiable by City of Pomona volunteer name badges and will be driving in white Ford Maverick trucks with the Park Ambassador logo. The trucks are equipped with a variety of supplies such as First Aid kits, trash bags, pickers, gloves, caution tape, signs, etc. Ambassadors have been provided smart phones for communicating with City staff via phone and the Pomona Go app.

Park Ambassadors will play a crucial role by submitting reports to the City, detailing their activities, community engagements, and any challenges they encounter. At the conclusion of the pilot program, staff will provide an update on the findings to the City Council to seek further direction on the program. Stay tuned for more updates as we work together to create safer and more enjoyable parks for everyone.





TEEN PHOTOGRAPHY CAMP

FINANCE

<u>CITY OF POMONA'S PENSION OBLIGATION BONDS RATING OUTLOOK:</u> <u>UPGRADED TO AA- FROM A+</u>

The City has recently achieved an increased credit rating from <u>Fitch Ratings</u> which affirms the City's Pension Obligation Bonds rating outlook to 'AA-' from 'A+'. The enhanced credit rating indicates a significant milestone due to prudent financial management by the Pomona City Council. Likewise, it reflects continued strong fiscal

performance and potential for improved fiscal resilience based on the Consolidated Policies and Procedures to establish an updated fund balance policy increasing the benchmark limit from 17% to 25%. The upgraded credit rating has numerous advantages for the City and its residents. It reflects the increased confidence of external investors in the City's financial stability and creditworthiness. The rating improvements looks favorably in the financial market, resulting in lower borrowing costs for future infrastructure projects and other initiatives that will benefit our community and improve the quality of life for our residents. We recognize that the improvement in credit rating is not merely a validation of the City's past accomplishments, but a catalyst for even greater success in the future. We will continue to prioritize sound financial practices and transparency to sustain and further improve our creditworthiness.

This commitment by the Mayor and City Council to financial stewardship paved the way for this recognition and this momentum will only help propel the City of Pomona towards a brighter future.



SR-71 FREEWAY CONNECTOR AND ON-RAMP CLOSURES

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has announced various closures of State Route 71 (SR-71) between State Route 60 (SR-60) beginning Monday, July 22 through Friday, July 26 for road repair work. EXTENDED CLOSURE – The Rio Rancho on-ramp to Northbound SR-71 remains closed from June 10, 2024 through September 30, 2024 for ramp realignment. Detours will be posted.



<u>CONSTRUCTION UPDATE: STREET PRESERVATION – LOCAL, CITYWIDE</u> (FY 23-24)*


On June 3, 2024, the City Council awarded a contract to Gentry Brothers, Inc. to rehabilitate local City streets at various locations throughout the City.

The construction work is scheduled to start in late July 2024 and with anticipated completion by Spring 2025. The project scope will include the paving of various streets as well as completing corner ramp upgrades, sidewalk repairs, and installation of new sidewalks to further the City's progress toward ADA compliance. When complete, this project will rehabilitate approximately <u>4 miles</u> of pavement on <u>23</u> different streets. The attached Location Map identifies the streets included in this contract work, as funds allow.

Informational flyers on the project will be handed out to residents and businesses in the construction areas. Phone numbers for the contractor's cell phone and office will be provided on the flyer so that any problems or issues that may arise during construction can be dealt with effectively and quickly.

Please be patient and be prepared for additional travel time while these improvements are under construction.

WATER RESOURCES

JULY IS SMART IRRIGATION MONTH

Residential outdoor water use in the United States accounts for nearly 8 billion gallons of water each day, mainly for landscape irrigation. Experts estimate that as much as 50 percent of this water is wasted due to overwatering caused by inefficiencies in irrigation methods and systems. WaterSense labeled irrigation controllers can significantly reduce overwatering by applying water only when plants need it.

Replacing a standard clock-based controller with a WaterSense labeled irrigation controller can save an average home up to 15,000 gallons of water annually. To encourage our residents to save water, the Water Resources Department is providing you with another opportunity to participate in the complimentary Landscape Evaluation Program this fall. <u>DEMOLITION OF CITY OF POMONA'S OLD WATER YARD BRICK</u> BUILDING AND WAREHOUSE

On Monday July 15, 2024, the Southern California Gas Company (Gas Company) began the demolition of the Water Resources Department's (WRD) existing brick and steel warehouse buildings. Both buildings were upwards of one hundred years old. The warehouse had one of the oldest hydraulic elevators still in operation. Once the buildings are demolished and the debris is cleared, the Gas Company will begin the soil remediation to remove previous lampblack deposits within the soil.

The Gas Company owned the Water Yard sites at 148 N. Huntington St. and 752 W. Commercial St. previously. They used the site as a manufactured gas plant (MGP). The MGP industrial processes produced harmful material that currently remains in the ground. Some of these harmful materials include coal tar and lampblack. Under the regulation of the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) the Gas Company is going to remove the contaminated soil and replace it with clean soil. After the existing buildings are demolished the soil removal will begin. The new WRD building on Commercial St. was built upon a previously DTSC regulated clean soil site.







WATER RESOURCES WORKS ON AN EIGHT-INCH SECTION OF PIPELINE

On July 16, 2024, near the intersection of Santa Fe St. and Supply St., contractor Kiewit and the Water Department's Distribution team worked on abandoning a section of a pipeline that stretched from the Metro Link's parking lot to the south of the train tracks. Construction included adding a section of straight pipe to complete the work. A concrete-encased portion of pipe and fittings close to other active utility conduits were removed. Kiewit and the City were able to address the pipeline and fitting removal and avoid disruption to water services.
